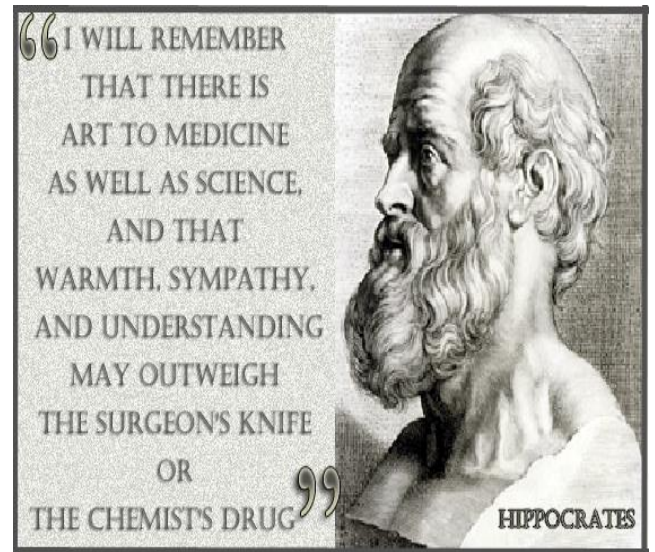

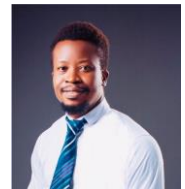



As we are all aware the Nigerian health sector suffered the worse effect of brain drain this year.

Undauntedly, we started sailing the NARD ship with strong determination to achieve our manifesto agenda which is to domesticate the DELSUTH Model and approach at both the National and across all states in Nigeria. In order to be focus, we anchored our blue print on the aims and objectives of NARD i.e to promote the interest and foster closer ties and relationships among members, to consider and express our views on all proposed regulations, policies and legislations affecting residency training in Nigeria and to promote improvement in healthcare delivery in Nigeria.

Although the year was characterized by a lot of challenges but with your overwhelming support and unity of purpose, we were able to achieve great milestones and feats. In all our activities, we were guided by our mandate which is to better the welfare of all members particularly the STHIs. I am very sure that we didn't disappoint you.

No doubt, some of our programmes and targets have been modified, some are in various "trimesters of gestation", some aborted, some in infancy stage while few others have remained in the pipeline due to the state of our finances occasioned by non-remittance of some members' dues (House Officers and those on GIFMIS platform) and the effects of the ongoing strike action that started since August 2nd 2021 due to insincerity of Government.

Permit me to attempt to give the synopsis of the activities and achievements of the year

LEADERSHIP RETREAT: On the 16th to 19th of November 2020, NARD leadership retreat held at the National secretariat of NARD in Abuja with the theme, "Policy Making AND IMPLEMENTATION in the Health Sector, the role of NARD" The President and Secretary of NARD also attended the NMA leadership retreat that held in Royal choice inn, CBD Abuja on the 14th November 2020.

COURTESY VISITS/MEETINGS: We immediately wrote letters of introduction of the new NOC to all stakeholders in the health sector including our parent body NMA. We also pay courtesy visits to all stakeholders and top government officials including the Secretary to the government of the federation, Mr Boss Mustafa, Speaker, house of Representative, chairman house committee on health, chairman senate committee on health, Hon, Minister of health, Director of Hospital Services, IPPIS Director, Accountant General of the federation, SIWC etc

NARD attended NMA NEC in Awka between 8th to 12th December 2020, ADM in Jos between 26th April and 2nd of May 2021 and the recent NEC meeting in Benin

STATE OF NARD;

1. MRTF: We were able to secure the balance of monies left in payment of 2020 MRTF and pay our members who were not paid. We have also secured 617,429,121.00 for the Arrears of 2020 MRTF as well as 4,802,828,800.00 for the payment of 2021 MRTF. We are awaiting payment
2. CENTRAL PLACEMENT OF HOUSE OFFICERS: This has been resolved significantly with almost all salary arrears paid. We also ensure the refunds of the illegally deducted monies for accommodation to our house officers
3. IPPIS MIGRATION: We secured waivers for not only our members on GIFMIS platform but also for all locum doctors in about twenty three FTHIs across the country with the assurance of migration into IPPIS. The processes of migration have started but will require follow up'
4. HAZARD ALLOWANCE: Discussions are already in advance stage with NMA
5. SALARY SHORTFALL 2014 TO 2016 {SKIPPING ARREARS}: This issue has finally been laid to rest with the government agreeing to pay. CMDs have been asked to resubmit the list of beneficiaries
6. BENCH FEE: This has been abolished due to our struggles
7. STHIs: In line with our campaign mandate, we empowered and fully supported the STHI committee to engage governments and managements of various state institutions owing our members. In particular the committee together with the NOC led by Mr President visited the Abia state governor who was owing our members

19 months salaries. Our intervention led to the payment of 4 months arrears to our members in ABSUTH. With constant and strategic engagements, we will achieve. DELSUTH has started the payment of MRTF following the ongoing strike action. We are also aware of other states like Lgos and Benue who have reached advance stages in the implementation of MRTF. In recognition of the plight of STHIs, this administration granted the request for STHI meetings during statutory meetings. The maiden meeting of STHIs held in Umuahia during the July NEC.

CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES: As part of our social corporate responsibility, we organized outreaches in collaboration with Khann foundation in Daura and Mani communities in Katsina State between 6th and 8th December 2020 and the 25th to 28th of June 2021

NARD also organized a medical outreach at Alor, Idemili-South local government area of Anambra state, the home town of the Hon Minister of labour and Employment, Sen. Dr Chris Ngige between 21st and 22nd of December 2020.

NARD HOUSING SCHEME: As one of the strategies to encourage members to stay back in the country, we keyed into the FMBN Housing Loan to build quality and affordable houses across the country. Presently we have NARD housing project on going in Abuja, Lagos, Awka, Enugu, Shagamu, Bayalsa and Delta state. These houses are at various stages of development.

NARD ONE IN A MILLION PROGRAM “TELEHEALTH”: In response to the new reality brought about by Covid 19 outbreak, we identified a need to minimize doctor patient while still providing quality health care to our patients. In view of this, NARD signed a contract with Decentralized Electronic Health Record (DEHR). A digital solution company based in UK with an online zoom platform for members to consult and manage patients at the comfort of their homes while making money for themselves.

NARD e-LIBRARY. This is a novel project for NARD. It is aimed at making study and research easy for all members.

RESEARCH/STATISTICS:

1. Expansion of Research Collaboration Network (RCN).

The trainee-led research collaboration currently has 276 members, making it the most extensive collaboration in sub-Saharan Africa. The third cohort was recruited in the early part of the year. The collaborators are from more than 40 Nigerian Association of Resident Doctors (NARD) centres. This collaboration has provided a veritable source of collaboration for members and foster improved career opportunities through scholarly

publications, among other things. The RCN has been a veritable source of research engagement and promotion of scholarship among NARDites in the year 2020/21

2. RSC/RCN website: The website has been updated. More than 18 blog posts were made in the year. (<https://nardrcn.com.ng/>).

3. Publications: A total of 7 articles from RSC/RCN were published 2020/21 executive year in peer-reviewed journals.

NARD FOUNDATION: We have completed the process of registration of the NARD Foundation. This foundation is established particularly to promote the social welfare and rehabilitation of members and their families during periods of distress

NARD ULTIMATUM/STRIKE: Arising from the January NEC meeting held in Owerri hosted by FMC Owerri, NARD gave 2months ultimatum to federal and State governments to among other issues review the current hazard allowance of 5 thousand naira upward

On the 18th of March NARD wrote a notice of indefinite strike to the government in order to urge them to attend to our issues in the ultimatum.

On the 31st of March NARD NOC had a meeting with the ministry of labour where an MOA was signed.

On the 1st of April NARD declared an indefinite strike due to lack of trust on government

On the 9th of April NARD NOC had another meeting with ministry of labour where the 2nd MOA was signed.

On the same day the house committee on health met with NARD NOC and pleaded that NARD should suspend the strike in honour of the Hon speaker. That he promised to address all our issues when he returns.

On the 10th of April NARD had an emergency NEC meeting and suspended the strike in honour of Mr Speaker and the MOA signed. A four week extension of ultimatum was issued to the federal and state government to allow them sort out all the issues as contained in the MOA signed.

On the 13th of April, the Hon Speaker of the house of Representative visited the NARD Secretariat where we had extensive deliberations on all the issues and he promised to pursue the MOA to ensure speedy resolution of all the issues. In particular he promised that the hazard allowance will be reviewed before the end of April and that MRTF will be put in the supplementary budget.

The 4weeks elapsed by 10th of May. Nothing was done. NARD extended the ultimatum again till her OGM in Awka on the 29th of May because of the role the Hon Speaker played as stated above. From the OGM NARD extended the ultimatum again by another 2weeks to allow the HOS complete the process of capturing and migration of our members to the IPPIS platform.

The 2week elapsed by 12th of June, yet our members on GIFMIS platform were not migrated to IPPIS as promised.

On the 23rd of June NARD held a virtual emergency NEC meeting where another notice of 4weeks ultimatum for resumption of the suspended strike if the lingering issues are not resolved.

The second statutory NEC meeting of NARD was hosted by FMC Umuahia between 26th to 31st of July 2021. At this meeting, NEC unanimously voted to resume the suspended total and indefinite strike starting from 2nd of August 2021 due to failure of Government to honour the agreement signed with them.

LEGAL BATTLE: NARD is currently in court with Federal Government due to the ongoing strike action. We have initiated the process of appeal of the NICN ruling on the 17th of September 2021 ordering us to suspend the strike without Federal Government meeting our demands.

Distinguished colleagues, above is the account of our stewardship in the past one year. We may not have gotten to our destination, but we have definitely made some significant progress. I urge the incoming NOC to maintain the momentum and follow up on the remaining issues to a logical conclusion.

APPRECIATION:

I thank God Almighty for everything. He is the giver of life and maker of kings. He gives power to whom He chooses. He protected us the numerous times we were on the road and air for NARD engagements. May His name alone be praised.

My very sincere appreciation to my lovely queen and wife for her prayers and tremendous support. I am forever grateful my angel.

I thank the President of NARD and all NOC members for their immense and unflinching support, teamwork, open criticism and constructive advice. I wish all of you well in your future endeavors.

I sincerely appreciate the two secretariat staff especially Mr. Anthony Nelkon for his humility and dedication to duty.

Finally, I want to specially thank the very vibrant and powerful NEC members for their cooperation and unflinching support throughout this tenure. I am entirely grateful for giving me the opportunity to serve. If in the course of my service as your Secretary General, I offended you, I profusely apologize, it was not intended but the result of human nature.

I sincerely urge you all to support the incoming Secretariat with prayers, patience and ideas.

Remember that our leaders derive their strength from the support we give them.

Once again, with a deep sense of fulfilment, I thank God as well as you all for the opportunity to serve you.

MINUTE OF THE 40th AGM OF NARD (PHYSICAL/VIRTUAL) HELD AT DELSUTH OGHARA September 25th 2020.

1. The NARD President Dr Aliyu Sokomba declared the AGM open at about 4:18pm.
2. The NARD President welcomed all members of the NOC, extended NOC, NEC and delegates
3. to the 40th AGM of NARD. He presented the agenda of the meeting for consideration.
4. The NARD President requested for input on the agenda from members. There was none.
5. The NARD President called for motion for adoption of the agenda.

6. OPENING PRAYER

7. The opening prayer was said in the individual faith for one minute.

8. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF NARD

9. The NARD President read out the aims and objectives of NARD.
10. A minute silence was observed for our departed colleagues.

11. PRESIDENT OPENING REMARKS

12. The NARD President gave his opening remarks. He thanked the Local Organizing Committee
13. for their efforts in organizing the AGM.

14. MINUTES OF JULY NEC 2020

15. The NARD President called for motion for the adoption of the minutes which was already
16. distributed to members electronically as a working document of the Association. He also
17. requested that members should go through the attendance attached to the minutes for
18. possible corrections.

19. STATE OF THE UNION:

20. i. MRTA Implementation and Funding.

21. The NARD President informed the AGM that only 4billion naira was uploaded for the
22. payment of 2020 MRTF. He said all processes for the payment of the MRTF has been
23. completed. That members will start getting alerts soonest.

24. He reminded the AGM that not all residents will be paid in 2020 as the approved amount will
25. not be enough to pay everyone. He however encouraged members that when the payment
26. for 2021 will be paid, those not paid in the first trench will be paid as their own start point.
27. He said that the chances for those on IPPIS to be paid next year is higher. He however said
28. that those on GIFMIS will not lose out. He encouraged NEC to ensure their members are
29. captured as quickly as possible.

30. COVID-19 HAZARD ALLOWANCE

31. The NARD President said three months of COVID-19 hazard allowance have been paid to
32. most residents on IPPIS and some on GIFMIS. He said Residents on GIFMIS in some centres
33. were not paid; He said he made efforts to sort out the problem. He reassured members yet
34. to be paid that they will be paid as their problems are being sorted out

35. NEW HAZARD ALLOWANCE.

36. The NARD President reminded AGM about the position of the Federal Government. He said
37. that the Minister of Labour had told him that the Federal Government has no plan of
38. continuing the COVID -19 inducement allowance after the first three months hence the need
39. to negotiate a new hazard allowance post COVID 19 for Doctors and other health workers.

40. SKIPPING ARREARS

41. The NARD President said unfortunately, NARD has not made significant progress on the
42. issue. He urge the incoming NOC to take up the matter.

43. Other items on the agenda were skipped.

44. CENTER REPORTS

45. Dr Omolola Alao, POTARD EKSUTH started by appreciating the President and NOC for the
46. support she got. She said that most of their issues are being attended to however some issues
47. are still pending. She said that their issues over the years is that their monthly subvention is
48. not enough to pay their salaries hence it's been carried over again and again.

49. The NARD President assured her of full support and advised her to always make recourse to
50. NARD when necessary. He said that the Governor spoke well of her when NARD met with
51. him.

52. Dr Ogungbemi Potard LAUTEC Oshogbo thanked the President and NOC for the approach
53. and doggedness in attending to the issues of STHIs. That they are no longer where they use
54. to be however he said there are still many challenges. No promotion since 2015 i.e no
55. financial backing to the upgrade being done. However 1st of February 2020 they achieved
56. CONMESS with skipping. Pending issues are promotion, no minimum wage, MRTA, COVID -
57. 19 allowance, life insurance. Sequel to NARD letters to the Governor, the Governor requested
58. that the chief of staff should meet with their EXCOS to look into the issues.

59. He pleaded for correspondences from NARD in resolving their issues.

60. Finally he informed the AGM that LAUTEC University is currently undergoing a split that may
61. lead to a change of name.

62. Dr Akingbola Ibrahim Ifeoluwa, President, ARD LAUTECH Teaching Hospital Ogbomoso
63. stated that majority of the problems affecting the LAUTECH TH has been resolved; they
64. received full corrected CONMESS in August 2020. The State Governor promised that the
65. Medical Residency Training Act will be factored into the 2021 budget and will be
66. implemented, payment of the 24 months' salary arrears started in August 2020. Currently
67. 10k monthly is been paid for COVID allowance with arrears from March to August.
68. Recruitment of new Residents and House Officers started yesterday.

69. Dr. John (LTH OGBOMOSHO) commended the President and stated that the Hospital had
70. issues with the payment of salary, but that has been resolved. Domestication of the Medical
71. Residency Training Act has been considered.

72. He implored the President to consider Institutions such as STHIs as the previous issues have
73. affected STHIs in capitation and payment of dues. He implored the house to consider STHIs
74. in clearing of NARD dues and Caucus dues that were owed previously because most of those
75. issues were not caused by them.

76. Dr. Sanni Oluyomi (Acting President, UNIMEDTH, Ondo) started by appreciating the NOC.
77. His speech was however interrupted by network.

78. Dr Oru Inestol, Potard NDUTH said they just achieved skipping arrears in their center. That
79. the MRTA is currently been looked into by the State Government, COVID 19 allowance is
80. been paid for just frontline workers. The major challenge in their center is shortage of
81. manpower.

82. Dr Sokolo Josephine, POTARD RSUTH stated that their challenges are much. That they are
83. not able to see the Governor yet. MRTA is still not domesticated in the state. The State House
84. of Assembly said the implementation of the MRTA will require an Executive order which only
85. the Governor can give. COVID 19 allowance is not paid and no promotion for members who
86. pass exams. She said that SRs that pass exams over 3yrs are still on CONMESS 2 hence most
87. of them are moving out leading to worsening manpower shortage. She appeal to NARD for
88. intervention on their issues.

89. Dr Amina POTARD BSUTH appreciated the NOC. Started by informing AGM that one of her
90. members tested positive and was treated. No issue with PPE. That the MRTA has been
91. domesticated in their center however they are still on strike because of funding of MRTA and
92. COVID 19 allowance. She said that in their meeting with the Governor two weeks earlier, he
93. promised to pay 20% instead of the proposed 50% by the Federal Government and they
94. refused. However the NMA Chairman just called her that the Governor has approved 25%
95. but they haven't accepted it. The Governor also promised to look into the issue of the MRTA
96. funding. Other issues facing her center included; no payment of minimum wage, skipping
97. arrears, improper placement of SRs and gross shortage of Residents.

98. Dr. Imoh Kingsley (President, ARD ABSUTH) appreciated NARD and afterwards stated the
99. problems they face in ABSUTH which includes; Non-payment of 16 months' salary, the
100. Medical Residency Training Act has not been domesticated(Old CONMESS is still in use), no
101. COVID-19 inducement allowance, no skipping and there is shortage of residents across
102. departments as most residents are leaving. They met with the governor on the 5th of
103. September and he promised to resume payment of their salaries but no plan on how to pay
104. the arrears. He implored NARD to write a letter to their State Governor as regards the 16
105. months' salary and to also help look into the aforementioned problems.

106. The NARD president invited the South-East Caucus leader to respond to the complaints given

107. by the President of ABSUTH ARD.

108. Dr. Dubem (Immediate past leader of the NARD South East Caucus) informed the house of
109. the election of Dr Ekeoma from UNTH as the new Caucus leader and the DCL is Dr. Asogwa
110. from AEFETHA. He assented to it that the ABSUTH residents are being owed and the caucus
111. have written severally to the government as regards this. He stated that this situation applies
112. to other residents in some other STHIs in the south east and so they have issued two weeks
113. ultimatum to the governors for an indefinite strike to be embarked on by all the STHIs in the
114. south east that their Governor are not doing well and subsequently all centers in south east
115. will join in solidarity. He implore NARD to look into the matter holistically.

116. Dr Isoje Daniel, POTARD DELSUTH stated that they have been able to get the domestication
117. of the MRTA with the Funding component as 400k per resident per year totaling 2,000,000
118. per residents for 5 years.

119. He also reminded the AGM that the stated Governor Commissioned the ARD DELSUTH
120. multipurpose building yesterday during the opening ceremony. He said that the building was
121. started by his predecessors but completed by his EXCO. He however stated that the major
122. challenge facing the center is that of Exit of Residents, that the management of DELSUTH
123. should follow the Medical Resident Training Act otherwise the association may go on strike
124. to fight for her members. He ended by appreciating AGM for the opportunity given to ARD
125. DELSUTH to host them.

126. The NARD President commended Dr Isoje Daniel for his achievements for ARD DELSUTH.

127. TALLY DISTRIBUTION BEGINS

128. The first Vice President Dr Julian Ojebo stated that according to Article 12 Section 12.1b of
129. the NARD constitution financial members are the only persons that tallies will be given to.
130. Those who have the tallies will be recognized by the president to address the floor of the
131. house.

132. COMMITTEE REPORTS

133. The Chairman, Medical education committee gave a report of the activities of the committee
134. which was constituted at January NEC to comprise of the VP2, Dr. Owolabi- Chairman,
135. Ibrahim Banaro Albakar- Secretary, Namdi Anibo, Tajudeen and Dr. Balogun Fatai.

136. The year planner of activities and programs was submitted to the NEC which included;

137. To have NARD as a CME accredited body.

138. To give award of academic excellence to the best Part1 and Part2 candidates that are
139. members.

140. To engage in other previously submitted activities.

141. Actions have been taken to achieve the proposed plans with potential positive results.
142. They plan the review of the MRTA but was advised to step it down to allow for
143. implementation first.
144. Dr. Famba Famba Daniel, Chairman of the Corporate Strategy Implementation Committee,
145. gave a report of the activities of the committee. The committee was formed during January
146. NEC.
147. Their activities include; To establish and publicize the orphans of Doctor's program. To
148. recruit well-meaning Nigerians as Orphans of Doctors Ambassadors with the aim of taking
149. care of children of late resident Doctors up to the age of 18 years.
150. Report all forms of assault and provide practical solutions to reduce or totally eradicate
151. assaults on Doctors.
152. Criteria: one or both parents must be resident, the parent who is a resident must have died,
153. the child or children must be less than 18years old.
154. Funding of the program: 10% of NARD annual revenue, 10% of the chapter dues, donations
155. from the public.
156. Services; payment of school fees. Hospital Bill's and feeding. Action: Google form was created
157. for registration.

172. 2. Transformed the Nigerian Journal of Medicine (NJM) to a digitalized and globally
173. accessible journal.
174. 3. The issues published by NJM can now be cited online by international medical
- professionals as well as indexing organizations. NJM has been registered with more
- abstracting and indexing organizations e.g Google scholar, ebsco etc which has made

the journal to be widely sought after.

175. 4. Editorial board applied to be indexed again by PUBMED after being delisted in 2016
176. with substantial progress.
177. 5. NJM now has more acceptability by Nigerian institutions with over 90% of all Federal,
178. State and Private tertiary institutions in Nigeria being able to use the Nigerian Journal
179. of Medicine as a tool for promotion of their staff and consultants.
180. 6. Increased number of articles submitted by both Nigerians and International authors
181. to the Nigerian Medical Journal.

199. At this point the NARD President called for a break to allow the hall to be arranged for the
200. dinner.

201. The president stated that after recess, 3 items shall be taken: the financial report, secretariat
202. reports and correspondences and the proceed to the main business which is elections
203. thereafter we shall take the skipped items of the agenda i.e the minute of the last minute and
204. matters ARISING from the minutes which according to him have been trashed out.

207. representative of Gombe State Governor invited to receive the award of excellence in terms



MINUTES OF NEC MEETING OF THE NIGERIA ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENT DOCTORS OF NIGERIA (NARD) HELD AT THE VILLA GARDEN HOTEL HALL, CONCORD AVENUE, NEW OWERRI, IMO STATE.

9.35am. The NARD President called the meeting to order.

9.36am. Opening prayer was said by Northwest CL.

PRESIDENT OPENING REMARKS

9..39am. The NARD President thanked the Almighty God for journey mercies and welcomed all members of the NOC, extended NOC, NEC and delegates to the 41ST OGM of NARD. He thanked the Local Organizing Committee for their efforts in organizing the OGM.

9.45am. A minute silence was observed for the souls of our departed colleagues.

9.48am. He presented the agenda of the meeting for consideration.

The NARD President requested for input on the agenda from members. There was none.

9.50am. Dr Umar, POTARD AKTH moved a motion for adoption of the agenda and was seconded by POTARD FMC Asaba

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF NARD

10.00am. The NARD President read out the aims and objectives of NARD.

10.10am. The minutes of 2020 AGM was read by the Secretary General.

10.30am. The NARD President called for corrections of the minutes and there was non. He therefore called for the adoption of the minutes which was already distributed to members electronically as a working document of the Association.

10.35am. POTARD FMC Yenagoa moved the motion for the adoption of the minutes and was seconded by POTARD UCTH.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES/STATE OF NARD.

1. MRTF (2020/2021)

10.40am. The NARD President gave an update on the 2020 MRTF payment. That about 1,300 members were not paid and 558 members were paid in error. He stated that when the list of erroneously paid was asked for initially, NARD got only 89. But when the NOC insisted that centers that do not send their list would not be recognized for payment of the next badge, the list increased from 89 to

558. He stated that some of the leaders shielded some people's payment out of selfish and personal interest.

He further said some members were paid twice from the recent payment and most of them did not inform the association. He said it took the Fin. Sec. and the VP1 a lot of time before they could identify some of those paid twice, and when they were called, they responded that they planned to inform the association. He urge members to always be honest and honorable.

- 10.55am. The POTARD of FMC Asaba referred back to the 4 Billion Naira released for the MRTF and asked for the total number of Resident Doctors that would be paid. The NARD President answered that, 8,000 multiply by 542,000 Naira will give 4.336 Billion Naira. He said that NARD has made enquiries from the budget office and they said they have more than the 4.336 Billion Naira to pay the 2021 MRTF.
- 11.10am. The POTARD of FMC Asaba asked if the 2021 MRTF payment list can be given to the President of each centers for them to confirm and be sure that the list contains the names of all their members. And the NARD President replied him that it has to be discussed with the CMDs of each centers.
- 11.15am. The POTARD of FCM Keffi said in response to what the NARD President said earlier about some centers getting 100% while some are getting less than 50%. He stated that no centers should be paid 100% since The Federal Government did not pay 100% for the MRTF. The NARD President answered that 979 names were submitted by FMC Keffi and over 100 of the 979 were new residents. He also stated that the number submitted for capturing is far more than what should be submitted.
- 11.20am. The POTARD of FMC Keffi said that across board, the more residents a center have, the higher the percentage payment to that center.
- 11.25sm. The POTARD of FMC Zaria asked if there is a specific plan for getting a comprehensive list for the payment of 2021 MRTF. He also asked when the payment deadline would be. The NARD President said that the NOC have proposed that the center Presidents and CMDs should work together and come up with the list. He also stated that the members should trust the leaders and stop causing confusions because that is the only way forward.

He appealed that action should be taken in order to rectify the issue of members that has not been paid.

He also said that members that have not been captured should make themselves known so that the issue can be rectified with IPPIS.

- 11.35am. The POTARD of JUTH said that in his center some new residents were paid while older ones were left out. He appealed that center presidents should be consulted before the decisions are made to avoid similar mistake. He also said that some of his members have been captured but are yet to be migrated into IPPIS.
- 11.45am. The NARD President called for the way forward on 2021 MRTF. He called of the caucus leaders to give their caucus position on the payment of 2021 MRTF.
- 11.50am. The Caucus leader (Dr. Usman Abubakar) stated that all the questions has been answered. He further stated that the payment list for the 2021 MRTF should be compiled by the centers in conjunction with their CMDs.
- 11.55am. The south east CL said that his caucus said we should find out the amount budgeted for 2021 MRTF and to see the list before payment is made.
- 12.00pm. The northwest CL said his people want us to work effortlessly to be sure that 2021 MRTF is paid on time. They want us to have timeline.
- 12.10am. The South South CL supported the position of the previous speakers. He said all that his people wants is that the list should be generated by the center Presidents in collaboration with the CMDs.
- 12.20pm. The southwest CL said his people wish that MRTF is paid early so that those going for exams in April will benefit. He encouraged center Presidents to ensure that their members are captured so that they can benefit from MRTF.
- 12.30pm. The NARD President in his response urged the center presidents to liaise with their various CMDs to harmonize the list generated to avoid unnecessary mistakes. He further stated that some information is better not released on social media to avoid the information falling into the wrong hands which could cause further confusion.

He stated that the list would be released to the Caucus leader for comparison with the list submitted by the center presidents.

2. Group life insurance for Doctors and other health workers

12.35pm. The NARD President called for input on the issue of Life Insurance.

He stated that the association has petitioned the FG that no Life Insurance has been paid to the next of kin of any member of the association. He said the petition was well received and a meeting was summoned by the National Assembly where the, VP1, Sec Gen and IPSG represented us. JOHESU was also present with its own petition, and the insurance company was present at the meeting as well.

At the meeting, the insurance company stated their claim but an issue came up where a Director claimed not to have received the petition from NARD hence the hearing was adjourned. The meeting is to be reconvened at a later date before conclusion would be reached.

3. House Officers central placement.

2.40pm. The President asked the IPSG to brief the house. IPSG did. Some of the concerns raised included. Fear of government wanted to divide our ranks, difficulties in getting our dues, incompetence of MDCN, etc.

2.45pm. The President reassure members that the issues will be dealt with. He said that a letter will be written to the MDCN stating our concerns.

CENTER REPORTS

The NARD President called on the Southwest for the summary of their center report

12.50pm. The SW caucus leader started by thanking the president and NOC

- He said as at 2017, the resident doctor strength at FNPH YABA was 60 but it is now 23 and employments are not being made. He urged NARD to intervene by speaking to the CMDs and the Ministry because the stress is too much for on Residents leading to high rate of covid infection.
- The minimum wage arrears have been causing mayhem at the FMC Ido-Ekiti. They requested that it should be part of our communique.
- He also stated that a lot of members on GIFMIS are not being paid especially in UCH Ibadan.
- The LAUTECH Teaching Hospital Ogbomosho has about 6 months unpaid minimum wages arrears and shortage of man power. He however said that employment avert has just been placed and 30 new houses have been released

to accommodate new doctors. They thanked NARD for the support and intervention.

-UNIMEDTH received full salary last in October and the governor wants to start paying 50% of salaries by January.

The University Teaching Hospital, Osogbo (the formal LAUTECH Teaching Hospital) has been renamed as UNIOSUN Teaching Hospital, Osogbo. Also, they said that there is shortage of man power. Presently house officers are needed and the CMD is willing to employ but people are not yielding because of the low pay.

The NARD President advised the center presidents that they need to be proactive and not reactive in order to get the desired results for their various members.

1.10pm. Northwest caucus presented his center report. He stated that majorly that there is shortage of house officers in most of the centers in his Caucus.
-In most centers COVID-19 arrears has not been paid.

1.20pm. The NARD President called on the South-south Caucus leader for the summary of their center report.

He stated that most transition processes in the Caucus were peaceful and thank the NOC for the support and intervention in crisis resolution in some of the centers.

The new NEC members in the Caucus were welcomed.

-NDUTH Okolobiri, the center was able to achieve skipping for its member and there was implementation of MRTF for the resident doctors at the center. There was also success story by most of the residents that went for examination.

-FMC YENAGOA have issues of pending salary arrears due to no work no pay, skipping arrears and bench fee.

-FNPH Calabar was vandalized during the END SARS Protest.

-UUTH, letters of exit have been written to members. Exco meeting with management on the issue has no head way yet.

-RSUTH have the issue of skipping, minimum wage arrears and COVID-19 allowance

-ISTH has the highest number of LASSA Fever and COVID-19 infection due to lack of adequate protective gears for the residents in the center. They have lost close to 50 to 70 members due to brain drain.

-The SSC thanked the NOC for the support they rendered in resolving crisis at University of Port Harcourt Teaching Hospital.

However they have huge financial burden to NARD. The president of the center has appealed to NEC to look into the situation.

The NARD President responded that if the budget is being checked, there are always debts being owed to NARD for over 5 years. He said it is high time all these stop. He added that all the centers should be honorable enough to take care of their various responsibilities.

1.30pm. The NARD President called on the Southeast Caucus leader for the summary of their center report.

He stated that there was a smooth transition of 2020 to 2021 administration in the Southeast zone.

He said he visited ABSUTH Aba Teaching Hospital and he was devastated seeing malnourished resident doctors everywhere. The Residents are being owed 19months salary. He appealed for NARD intervention on this issue.

They also have burden of shortage of manpower.

-IMSUTH was owed 3months salary arrears.

-NOHE had an issue of paying dues because they cannot deduct from source.

-He stated that a lot of centers have not been paid minimum wage arrears.

He also said that the Southeast caucus supports the abolishment of the bench fee. -He mentioned the shortage of PPE in their various centers.

-He stated that an incident happened when the caucus meeting was ongoing, the POTARD of IMSUTH has a little accident with the driver to the PA of the Governor, and the POTARD of IMSUTH was beating by thugs. He said fortunately, a government official witnessed the incident and called the Police and this made the thugs to run away, and that also helped the president to run

for his life with his car too. He stated that they had to leave the meeting and ran to the Police Station to resolve the issue. He pleaded that NARD should send a warning letter to the security agencies to stop treating doctors that way. He rounded up by thanking the NARD President and the NEC for their time.

1.40pm. Northeast Caucus leader presented their report.

Taraba State ARD are presently on strike and they are awaiting the return of the governor. They thanked the NOC for the support so far. Their issues included skipping, covid allowance, man power shortage and MRTA.

-FMC Jalingo expresses their willingness to join in solidarity to make it effective.

-FTH GOMBE has a lot of problems ranging from COVID-19 allowance to MRTF

-FMC Jalingo has good news. Their new CMD is doing well. They want NARD to write a letter of appreciation to her.

-UMTH praised their governor for given 500k to every indigenous Resident yearly regardless of where they work.

1.50pm. The NARD President called on the North Central Caucus leader for the summary of their center report.

He started by thanking the president and NOC for the efforts so far. That there are some global problem in his caucus but are more peculiar to some centers in NARD.

-FMC Makurdi have the issue of promotion after passing of examination with much financial implications. It is a reoccurring problem in the centers and NARD intervention is needed on this issue to help rectify the problem.

-He also stated that there is problem of entry points in some the hospitals. The National Hospital, Abuja appeared to be the most affected here where the entry point of is 2.2 and they have to spend up to 6months before being promoted to 3.2 most times.

-This case is said to be similar to FCTA. And all these happened with no concrete reasons.

-The FMC, Keffi also experience similar issue but they have been given 3.2 and subsequently now taken to 3.3. It was said that they should have a unified

entry point being federal centers. FMC Keffi is hoping to get more intervention concerning the issue of skipping and the promotion arrears that has not been paid since 2018. Moreso, the center have some peculiarity regarding the specialist allowance. FMC, Keffi needs the intervention of NARD to help solve these problems.

-The FMC, Bida is currently experiencing shortage of manpower and the issue of minimum wage arrears being owed to house officers. The FCTA has the problem of IPPIS migration. They were migrated to IPPIS last year and there was issue of delayed salaries, the center has been trying to get sorted out but there are still members who have not been paid. The center asked for NARD intervention.

-BSUTH, MRTA has been domesticated but there are problem of funding. They also have the problems of Skipping and payment of house officers arrears. The NARD President urged all the center presidents to please get the list on minimum wage arrears ready before 4pm on monday for follow up in IPPIS office on Tuesday.

-UITH also is faced with shortage of manpower and shortage of protected gears for attending to COVID-19 patient. They also appealed to NARD for intervention regarding these issues.

-He said JUTH also is faced the issue of minimum wage and issue of IPPIS migration too.

-KSSH has started receiving the alert of full skipping and promotion arrears as far back as 2018. They appreciate the Governor of the State, the NARD leadership, and the NEC for their support over the years.

The Nasarawa State ARD is faced with some inter-association issues that have degenerated and the management has written to the ARD that resident doctor training has been suspended temporarily in the centers and a committee has been setup to reassess the program within a month. NARD and NOC intervention is needed to help resolve these issues in the nearest possible time.

Reports on centers with crisis

2.00pm. The NARD President called on the VP2 for update on FMC Asaba crisis. The VP2 stated that himself and the Fin. Sec. of NARD (Dr. Okeke Kingsley) visited FMC Asaba on the 20th of December in regards to the petition written

to the NARD leadership on the issue of undeserved disqualification by their ARD electoral committee, and to conduct a new and fair election which would be acceptable to all. He said that upon arrival, a meeting was setup with the electoral committee, both presidential aspirants, and other interested persons. They declared campaign open immediately to end by 12am on Tuesday, 22nd of December and election to start by 9am and ends by 2pm on Wednesday, 23rd of December with no exemption of any candidate.

After all the processes, the NOC met with the CMD and he expressed relief based on the work done by the NOC representatives in averting further crisis in his center.

A meeting was later held on that same day by the NOC representatives and past president of the ARD Asaba. Following the elections, sorting and counting of votes were observed by the agents of contestants and they were satisfied with the process.

Dr. Adugo Chris and Dr. Asore emerged as the President and General Secretary respectively.

The results were verified and attested to by the agents of contestants and they counter signed the hard copy. The elected exco were immediately sworn in by the NARD by the VP2 of NARD in the presence of the Financial Secretary of NARD.

2.10pm. The NARD President called on the VP1.

The VP1 thanked the President and read the report on the visit of the NOC delegation to FTH, Gombe to conduct election. He stated that the delegates arrived in Gombe on the 6th of January, and they met with the past president of NARD who was given the task of supervising the election, and the NOC delegates also met with other elders of the association. On the second day which is Wednesday, 7th of January, the delegates met with the management board to inform them of NOC's mission. A robust discussion was made bothering on the entry point, COVID-19 arrears, and MRTF. And the delegates found out that the entry point for the center is 3.4, but there are some entry point issues with the house officers which were also addressed.

He said that they made passionate appeal to the CMAC who represented the CMD to ensure that the issue are resolved. On the same day a meeting was held with the past president of the center Dr. Zawaya where the modality of the election was properly explained to everyone for better understanding.

The election was observed on Thursday, 8th of January and it was a free and fair election. A banquet was organized after the election.

2.20pm. The NARD President called on the Northwest Caucus leader for the summary of the report on FMC Gausu.

The Caucus leader stated that on a day to the election, the crown prince and him met with both parties. He said on Wednesday afternoon, the suspended AGM was reconvened and the electoral criteria were set up. He stated that it was made known that only financial members would take part in the electoral exercise.

He stated that the election started on Wednesday afternoon and was concluded in the night on that same day. And Dr. Hussain and Dr John emerged as president and Secretary respectively. The excos were sworn in and their cooperation was sought in order to work with the association for the progress and unity of the association.

Conclusively, he thanked the NOC members for their support and intervention for the center.

2.40pm. The leader of Southsouth Caucus stated the position of the caucus on the issue of Life Insurance that, NARD should ask for the Life Insurance and maintain its stand on the issue because a lot of members are lost to COVID-19, LASSA fever, and lot more.

The Southwest, Southeast, Northcentral, Northeast also stated that the Life Insurance should be pushed by NARD with great force to ensure the payment of the Life Insurance.

2.50pm. The leader of Southwest Caucus stated that centers should also liaised with insurance company for local insurance of its members.

2.55pm. The NARD President advised that NARD should make research of notable insurance company and make use of it.

WAY FORWARD ON THE MATTERS ARISING

3.05pm. The NARD President called on the Southwest Caucus Leader to make his input on the way forward.

3.08pm. The Southwest Caucus Leader stated that rising from the ongoing NEC meeting, the Federal Government should be given 21 days ultimatum for increment of hazard allowance hence they would withdraw and prevent themselves of being killed by COVID-19.

3.10PM. The NARD President called on the Northcentral Caucus Leader.

The Northcentral Caucus Leader thanked the president and lay emphasis on the issue of hazard allowance that Northcentral Caucus suggest that NARD should push further to getting the hazard allowance paid than leaving it for NMA to decide, and NARD should be more at the forefront of the discussion and there should be a timeline for review and decision making on the issue.

3.12PM. It was unanimously agreed that NARD should give FG 21 days ultimatum be given to FG on the issue of hazard allowance.

NARD PROJECTS

1. NARD HOUSING PROJECT

3.15pm. The chairman NARD Housing committee made a presentation and the ongoing NARD Housing project. Account opening forms were circulated by staff of FHA.

The NEC applauded the NOC for the Housing initiative. Questions were asked and clarifications given by the committee chairman.

2. Telehealth

3.35pm. The chairman Telehealth committee made a zoom presentation to the NEC on what Telehealth is all about and the benefits to NARDITES. The idea was unanimously supported by the NEC.

3. E-LIBRARY

4.17pm. The NARD President gave an insight on the reason for the proposed e-library. He thereafter called on the company invited for the project to make presentation to the NEC about the proposed e-library.

5.00pm. Dr Lawson Obazenu, the Chief Editor of NARD applauded the presentation and gave his support for the project.



4. NARD FOUNDATION.



1. The meeting was called to order by 2:40pm and opening prayer was said by North West
2. Caucus leader Dr. Diggi.
3. The agenda of the meeting was read by the President who later called for corrections and or
4. modifications.
5. Dr Ajayi Abass called the attention of the house to the omission of COVID-19 allowance
6. arrears and it was agreed that it should be added to the agenda for discussion.
7. Thereafter, the motion for adoption of the corrected agenda was moved by Dr Yusulf
8. Abubakar and seconded by Dr. Abass Ajayi.
9. A minute silence was observed for the departed colleagues.
10. Minute of the last January NEC meeting was read by the Secretary General, Dr. Isogun and no
11. corrections were made.
12. Mr President opined that matters ARISING from the minutes be taken alongside center
13. reports as the reports from the centers especially on the issues of HOs and members on
14. GIFMIS platform salaries will guide the our discussion. This was agreed by the house.
15. **CENTER REPORTS**
16. POTARD RSUTH, Dr Ela reported some of the achievement in his center which included;
17. training grants for members, prompt payment of salaries, and the assurance of MRTF to be
18. presented to the House of assembly by June.
19. POTARD OAUTH started by thanking the NOC especially the PRO and financial sec for their
20. very helpful efforts in resolving the issues of HOs salaries in his center. He reported the issue
21. of manpower shortage in his center. He however said that they just got approval recently for
22. Employment and interview would commence the following week. He also said that COVID-
23. 19 allowance arrears have not been paid to some of his members.
24. The SOTARD FCM Asaba, Dr Asore gave his center report. He thank NOC for the efforts in
25. resolving the HOs salary issues. The said that the few still remaining are being handled by
26. the fin sec. He informed the house about the successes of MOs in training in his center. He
27. went further to highlight the challenges such as MRTF and COVID-19 allowance arrears not
28. being paid.
29. FMC Ebute Meta reported that 6 house officers are still been owed January salary and some
30. members on GIFMIS are not being paid.

31. POTARD FMC Keffi thanked the President and NOC. He reported that MDCN has come for
32. reaccreditation of the center and they are awaiting the result. He reported that no house
33. officers are being owed in his center except refund for accommodation but MO are still being
34. owed promotion arrears.

35. The NARD President called on Dr. Okeke POTARD FCM Abuja to explain to the house how
36. things are done in his center concerning promotion arrears. Dr. Okeke enlightened the house
37. and said that the amount being owed can be calculated by each person.

38. The VP1 stated that each doctor can calculate the total amount being owed him/her.

39. Dr Apollos, FTH Gombe thanked the President and the NOC and reported that entering point
40. has been adjusted to com 3 step 3, and they recorded successes in the last examinations in
41. his center. However, minimum wage arrears not being paid, migration from GIFMIS to IPPIS
42. is still a problem.

43. Potard UCTH Calabar thank the NOC and the fin sec in particular for the efforts on the HOs
44. salary issues. He said most of them have been paid and they send their appreciation. He also
45. reported the regularization of locum doctors in his center and that their biometrics had been
46. sent to IPPIS.

47. The President asked what the CMD had done concerning promotion arrears. VP1 also asked
48. the POTARD of UCTH to look into the various letters of employments for dates and get back
49. to him on phone.

50. The POTARD of UCTH Calabar asked for verification on the unremitted check off dues.

51. ThebNARD President said the MDCN still refused to remit the dues. He used the opportunity
52. to inform the house that for the past 5months, NARD have been operating with half dues.

53. Those on GIFMIS are not paying and now HOs dues not been remitted.

54. He said out of the #1000 paid as dues, 400naira goes to the NARD publication and 600naira
55. to NARD account. The President also explained that he inherited debts upon resumption and
56. those debts have been cleared. Hence, there is no money.

57. Dr Divine FMC Yenogua thanked the President and NOC and reported that her center has no
58. problem with GIFMIS.

59. However 5 members are yet to be paid COVID-19 allowances.

60. Potard BSUTH reported problems with skipping and minimum wage arrears, one of their
61. members being assaulted and the actions that have been taken. It was also reported that
62. letters have been written to the Nigerian Army in respect of that.

63. The President appreciated BSUTH and Parklene for paying all their dues including strikes
64. dues.

65. FETHA thanked Mr. President and NOC. He said HOs in his center are still being owed
66. February salary and he has been liaising with the Fin. Sec to get that sorted. Also, 3 months
67. of housing fee refund is still being owed, some members are owed COVID-19 allowance, and
68. his center is missing in the list for death in service benefits.

69. Potard Kogi State Specialist Hospital informed the house that his state government has
70. implemented payment of minimum wage and payment for updates and examinations.

71. Dr Badmus, potard UITH, Ilorin thanked the NOC and reported that his members on GIFMIS
72. are yet to be paid. He informed the house that about employment of about 60 new residents
73. and MOs. He said that they have not been paid because they have not been captured on IPPIS,
74. COVID-19 arrears have not been paid to the HOs. He also reported that there is 120 slots for
75. the HOs but the center have about 60 HOs, MDCN posted 42 HOs but only 28 have resumed
76. and it is over 4 weeks now but the rest are yet to resume.

77. Potard National Hospital Abuja greeted the house and reported that the center is doing well
78. but still have some members who are yet to be paid COVID-19 allowance.

79. The SOTARD JUTH greeted the house and reported the unavoidably absence of his center
80. President. He informed the house that they have 100% IPPIS captured success, and all HOs
81. have been paid except 2 HOs which they are currently sorting out in collaboration with the
82. fin sec.

83. The POTARD of UNIMED, Ondo thanked the President and the NOC members for their
84. endless efforts and contributions. He stated that the last salary received by them in the center
85. is December salary. He also stated that the State Governor called for a meeting about 2 weeks
86. ago saying he is going to pay 50% of February salary which the center disagreed with, and a
87. 14 days ultimatum was given for the 100% salaries to be paid.

88. The POTARD of ARD ABSUTH, Aba greeted the President and the NOC. He thanked them for
89. their supports and stated that their center is being owed 21 months' salary arrears. He said
90. several efforts has been made to meet with the Governor but all was in vain. He also stated
91. that MDCN brought up accreditation suspension of the center, and then, a meeting was finally
92. held with the State Governor who then promised to pay 3 months but no one has received a
93. dime up till now.

94. The NARD President stepped in, explained and advised better that the only thing they can do
95. as a center is to increase their energy on advocacy and publicity.

96. The POTARD of NOHE said the payment of salaries should be taken seriously. He also

97. lamented shortage of manpower in his center. She urged the President and the NOC to kindly
98. see to these issues.

99. The POTATD of FMC, Abuja stated the issue of non-payment for the house officers. He said
100. posting has been an issue in the center. He also stated that MRTF and 2020 COVID-19
101. allowance have been paid to most of them in the center. He thanked the President and NOC
102. for their efforts.

103. The POTARD of ARD Gombe, warmly greeted the President and NOC. He listed all their
104. achievements in the center and thanked the president for making it possible. He stated that
105. the issue of COVID allowance has been the major challenge of the center and pleaded with
106. the President and NOC to come to their Rescue.

107. Mr President introduced agenda 10 which was State of NARD/NARD ultimatum. He stated
108. that our ultimatum that was basically on salaries of HOs and members on GIFMIS platform,
109. IPPIS migration, MRTF and hazard allowance had elapsed. He went further to state that he
110. wants the house to address the issue dispassionately based on the performance of
111. government so far and the reports from our various centers.

112. He informed the house that a meeting was held with the Federal Government, where the
113. Minister of Finance said that the money for 4 months payment for the members on GIFMIS
114. was available and that the payment would be made before 7th of May, 2021. However as it
115. stands, members only got one month salary on the 6th and 7th.

116. He said the HOSF said some delegates were sent to UCH and found that there were ghost
117. workers in their payroll hence they stopped payment of the salaries and recommend
118. physical verification in the centers affected before recommencing payment. She also wants
119. CMDs of affected centers to seek for approval for Employment to revalidate the employment
120. status of those on GIFMIS before IPPIS migration will be done. The NARD President however
121. said that how and when verification is done should not be the problem of any member of
122. NARD. What matters is that members salaries are paid on the stated time.

123. The POTARD of UPTH blamed the CMDs and the Government on the issue of non-payment of
124. GIFMIS. She stated her disappointments and thanked NARD for its endless efforts.

125. The POTARD of Gombe thanked the house and stated that the government response on
126. GIFMIS, IPPIS is just an excuse. He suggested that NARD demands for a clear duration on
127. IPPIS migration and the government stand on this issue.

128. The issue of minimum wage arrears was discussed too. The President stated that the money
129. for payment of minimum wage arrear is available and that members need to apply for it. The
130. President explained further that updated lists are needed from the centers that have not

131. submitted theirs for the payment of this arrear.

132. The President called on Chairman STHI committee to update the house on their activities so
133. far.

134. The Chairman of STHI said the President charged his committee that all the issues of State
135. tertiary institutions be given a maximum attention. He said State Governments were reached
136. out to since then starting with ABSUTH and they were granted the opportunity to meet with
137. the Governor. He stated that, poor salary scale, salary arrears and lots more was discussed,
138. and the Governor promised to rectify all this and also to give 80 Million Naira for arrears
139. payment but all these promises has failed. They are presently making efforts to see the
140. former governor Sen. Orji Uzor Kalu to intervene on the issue of ABSUTH.

141. He said instead of 20months salary arrears, ABSUTH is now counting 22months salary
142. arrears.

143. He stated that IMSUTH is another problem on its own, as they have not been able to meet
144. with the Governor despite all their efforts. He said 5months salary arrears has turned to
145. 7months salary arrears for them at IMSUTH. He also stated that employments are being
146. converted from residency to contract based.

147. UNIMED too is another State to be reviewed. He added that most center has issues of
148. accreditation and pleaded with NARD to please intervene and help rectify all these issues.

149. He advised the ARD present presidents to carry along their past president. He said they could
150. help rectify things easily too.

151. The POTARD of Nasarawa stated that he gets emotional whenever he hears about the issues
152. of ABSUTH and IMSUTH. He suggested the center should be shutdown since there is nothing
153. to keep those running it alive.

154. Dr. Omolola Alao addressed the house as regards the state tertiary institutions. She said ARD
155. cannot be divided, that it has to maintain its stand and stay as one. She also advised those at
156. state level to keep pushing that there would be positive changes someday.

157. The President called on the Fin. Sec for update on NARD debt. Which he did. The President
158. informed the house that there was a debt for the former NARD house secretariat. He said the
159. landlord of that house demanded a rent of 3million naira but NARD lawyer was involved and
160. was able to reduce it to the sum of 1million, one hundred and forty thousand naira which
161. was paid. He further said that the debt owed to National Hospital has been cleared.

162. NARD COURT CASES.

163. The report of all NARD court case which is being handled by Umar Kuko & Co was read to
164. the house by the Sec Gen.

165. The POTARD of Parklene asked for the outcome of proceedings of court case between Enugu
166. State and Parklene on strike issue.

167. CORRESPONDENCE.

168. The President called on the sec Gen to read out the correspondences received so far. The sec
169. Gen started by informing the house about the crisis in FMC Gusau, NOC's intervention and
170. the letters received from NW Caucus demanding for apologies from the NOC on the issue.

171. The POTARD, NOHE stated that the tone of the letter written to the NOC was too harsh and
172. they should apologize to the NOC for that.

173. Dr. Sanni said that there is a need to move in the direction of resolution. He said it is wrong
174. for the EXCO of Gusau to have arrested the IPP. He said the Caucus should have been carried
175. along on the issue of the suspension of FMC Gusau by the NOC. He however stated that it was
176. wrong for Caucus to write to NOC demanding for an apology.

177. Dr. Idrisu said it was rather unfortunate that the issue had been allowed to degenerate to
178. this level. He said he is not going to judge who is right or wrong but he is not also comfortable
179. with the act of arresting a fellow doctor. He implored and pleaded to everyone to allow the
180. issues to be sorted out amicably. He suggested that a committee be set up to look into the
181. matter.

182. Dr. Yusuf said that it is the duty of caucus leadership to help NOC resolve issues in the Caucus.
183. He expected the caucus to come in and sort things out rather than writing to the NOC

184. demanding for apologies. He suggested that the caucus withdraw the letter, said all should
185. calm down and look through the process dispassionately.

186. The CL of South East pleaded with everyone to calm down their emotions. He urged the North
187. West Caucus leader to allow peaceful resolution of the issue.

188. Dr. Julian said the President was not wrong in in taking a decision to suspend an EXCO that
189. arrested a member without informing the NOC. He quoted a section of the constitution that
190. said the NARD President shall coordinate all the activities of NARD and also in choosing the
191. crown Prince as the leader of the delegates to FMC Gusau. He cited his experience during his
192. tenure when he was given the task to look into Jos case. He said that delegation is always
193. guided by the constitution. In any committee with a member of NOC, automatically the NOC
194. member leads the committee. He said that it is an insult on the office of the president for such
195. a letter to have been written. He said that we must remind ourselves of truth on


196. constitutional matters.

197. The POTARD of FMC, Jabi quoted Act 13:1c which talk about disciplinary committee.


198. The POTARD, UUTH said the way forward is that NW CL should withdraw the letter and
199. apologize to the NOC and a new committee be set up.

200. The SOTARD of GASAU said that none will be surprised to have the IPP in police custody
201. because of what he did.

202. Dr. Diggi said that there was character assassination in the comments made by the President
203. that he was bias in the way they handle the crisis in FMC Gusau. He however apologized to
204. the NOC and OGM on the letter he wrote to the NOC.
205. NARD President said that the VP1 will lead a committee to sort out issue of FMC Gasau and
206. report back to July NEC this was accepted by the house.
207. Appeal for financial assistance for medical treatment of Dr Christine Ogbebor, a member of
208. ARD UUTH, Uyo was read by the sec Gen.It was however stepped down because of lack of
209. funds.
210. Applications for membership of ARD General Hospital Ilorin was also read to the house in
211. line with the constitutional requirement. The application will be ratified at the AGM.
212. The NARD President requested for a way forward on ultimatum for strike.
213. South East CL said the house should explore all options before taking a decision.
214. Dr. Divine, POTARD FMC Yenagoa said the ultimatum should be extended till July NEC-
215. meeting.
216. South West CL said 2weeks extension be given to allow time for the verification. He said that
217. waiting for July will put the EXCO on an edge.
218. Finally, the house unanimously agreed that a two weeks extension of the existing ultimatum
219. be given to the federal and State governments to allow them more time to sort out the
220. remaining issues. After the expiration of the extension, an E-NEC should be called to reassess
221. the demands on the ultimatum.
- 222. AOB**
223. Dr Aneke requested for payment of the 8million naira owed him from DTA during his tenure
224. as Secretary General of NARD. The President confirmed the debt and said that he also is being
225. owed some money. He said there is no money to pay that yet. He pleaded with him to exercise
226. more patience.
227. Dr Raji, the past financial Secretary of NARD gave explanation why the DTA was not paid
228. during his tenure. However, the President said past Presidents pay themselves and their
229. friends. He advise that the issue be left for now.
230. Mr President called for motion for adjournment.
231. Motion for adjournment was moved by Dr. Divine Irole and seconded by Dr. Abass Ajayi.

THE MINUTE OF THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COUNCIL (NEC) MEETING OF THE NIGERIAN ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENT DOCTORS WHICH HELD IN CONFIDENCE HOTEL UMUAHIA ON 30TH OF JULY 2021

The NARD President called the gathering to order after the quorum was formed.

- 10:04 am The VP2 Dr Ejiorfor Chukwujama recited the Hippocratic Oath in a call and response pattern.
- 10:05 am The President thanked God for journey mercies to the umuahia NEC meeting and further said that it is time to tell the Government that we are NARD, as he declared the meeting open.
- 10:07 am The Secretary-General read the minute of the May OGM held in Awka. Subsequently, the President called for corrections and or omissions.
- 10:30 am Dr Isodje Daniel, chairman STHI committee corrected that 80 million stated by the governor is for accreditation and not salary arrears.
- 10:30 am Dr Ilori Solomon stated that their centre report was not captured.
- 10:32 am Dr Edoga President ESUTH corrected that his Centre was spelt as pack lane instead of park lane.
- The president said that the minute is a usually summarized hence all center reports cannot be captured, however assured members that all corrections will be effected.
- 10:38 am The NARD president called for a motion of adoption of the minute as a working document of the association.
- 10:38 am The GEN-SEC of UUTH Dr Samuel moved a motion for the adoption of the minute as a working document of the association.
- 10:39 am Dr Afolabi POTARD LTH Osogbo seconded this motion.

MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTE

- 10:40 am President said that the governor of Abia state has invited him for a meeting and that means he will leave with some members of the NOC, so, therefore, will like to take the state of NARD which is same as matters arising from the minutes before handing over to the VP1, if the NEC approves. This was supported by the house.

STATE OF NARD

- 10:35 am President stated that we have given an ultimatum to the Federal Government in January this year, and it's time to look at the ultimatum. He listed the lingering issues in NARD, He then threw the issues to the floor for discussion.

1. Non payment of House of Salaries/non remittance of dues

He said on the issue of the House Officer's salary, the NOC feels that it is time to make a statement, as dues are not being paid and 114 members are still being owed.

The president recalled that these were the members that went to social media insulting NOC and NARD, yet they are not paying NARD dues. He further stated that he knows of centres that have collected dues for themselves and don't want to remit it to NARD, that he has personal family issues to attend to but because he is serving NARD he cannot, yet people collect dues for themselves.

- 10:40 am 10:44 am Dr Edoga stated that he agrees with NARD on the issue of the house officers and that it is time to make a statement. He further suggested that Dr Sanusi MDCN Registrar be called out and properly disgraced.
- 10:46 am The NARD president said that Sanusi wants him (Uyi) to come and beg him to pay dues and that will not happen, hence he will be called out by NARD.
- 10:47 am The President of ARD JUTH said that the decision to suspend the strike was premature.
- 10:47 am The NARD president called him to order, reminding him that he was part of the NEC, hence has no right to say that the strike was suspended prematurely. He told him that the JUTH president owes the house an apology for calling the decision to suspend the strike was premature.
- 10:49 am The JUTH President apologized for using the word premature, but that it is the view of many members of his congress.
- 10:51 am The JUTH president submitted that NARD should send an ultimatum for the resumption of the suspended strike.
- 10:54 am Dr Alfa Yusuf, President ARD FMC Bida stated that it is unfortunate that NARD is fighting for H.O, yet they are not paying dues. He added that the aim of the MDCN registrar, is to divide NARD and that he should be called out.
- 10:57 am Dr Hassan said that the NEC should go back home to educate the House Officers because by not paying dues, they are as good as not being part of NARD and that we should do everything possible to bring back the house officers.
- 10:58 am The president said that all president and General Secretaries should go back and collect dues from house officers by Hand.
- 11:00 am Dr Harrison Gen Sec ARD DELSUTH said that the president and secretaries of centres have a lot to do, by making House officers understand how they were paid, and if they want continuous support they have to pay dues. He said they should be discussed with but not threatened.
- 11:03 am The South West Caucus Leader Dr Sanni Taofoek stated that there are two issues at hand.
1. Source deduction – that this will be achieved through MDCN and NMA
- 11:06 am The NARD president informed that he would be leaving for the meeting with the Governor of Abia state and summarized the state of NARD.

1. On minimum wage, nothing is done
2. Hazard allowance nothing done.
3. Death in service is more of talk, but no action.
4. On withdrawal of HO circular, nothing has been done
5. MRTF said to have been captured in service-wide vote, but no assurance on when it will be paid
6. On GIFMIS Salary – some centres are yet to be paid.

- 11:30 am The president announced that he is leaving for the meeting and handed over the meeting to the VP1 (Dr Arome Adejo) to continue.
- 11:32 am The VP1 cautioned that many people don't pay attention during meetings and recalled the previous meeting in awka that only about 50% of the people who started the meeting stayed till the end of the meeting at 2:00 am. Therefore, he would be mean with the timing.
- 11:37 am The general secretary of ESUTH parklane stated that they were able to collect NARD dues from their members via their chief residents, and advised NARD to toll the same line for House Officers dues.
- 11:38 am The general Secretary of LUTH said that the issues are calculated effort by the MDCN to divide NARD hence must be resisted.
- 11:39 am The VP1 stated that the House Officers needs to be aware of what is going on, that if the MDCN can stop them from paying dues, that would mean NARD will not fight for them and if the attempt to remove them from the scheme of service succeeds, the MDCN will pay them what it deems fit.
- 11:41 am Dr Ameh said that we still depend on the power of NARD to get the House Officers dues from MDCN and said that there is a rapid decline in house Officers
- 11:42 am The VP1 stated that apart from calling for the head of Sanusi, other modalities are being put in place. To restore normalcy. But that NEC members should play their part in their centres.
- 11:44 am The President of FTH Gombe said that we should devise any means to deduct the dues, after all the NARD constitution did not state that dues from House Officers must be deducted from source.
- 11:45 am The VP1 re-emphasized the need for leaders to talk to their congress to see reasons with the issues, while NOC tackles Government.
- 11:49 am The South-West caucus leader asked how do we make House officers part of NARD, that we should deduct dues from House officers without MDCN and that will weaken the position of MDCN on NARD.
- 11:51 am The Assistant Secretary-General Dr Omolola Alao Stated that we are making it look like the house officers are controlling us. She also added that we should not destroy what we have here as resident doctors today will be consultants tomorrow, and young doctors will

become residents under you, hence the need to go back home and train the upcoming ones.

12:15 pm Dr Sunday Atinko reminded the NEC that NARD is the only representative of the medical profession, noting that NARD has taken doctors from level to level. He further suggested ways the House officers can be paid via IPPIS instead of MDCN. That this will resolve the issues of dues collection.

12:22 The VP1 concluded the matter by saying that NARD is going to fight for the dues however, each center must play their part.

12:30 pm The vp1 called for recess till 2:30 pm.

3:00 pm The meeting reconvened and was called to order by the VP1.

3:05 pm The president of UITH submitted that the era of lobbying is over and that he commends the NOC for taking steps appropriate steps.

3:07 pm The President of ARD UCH said that actions need to be taken on the issues and stressed the need to call out the head of service. He also spoke on salary arrears.

3:09 pm The VP1 SAID THAT HE IS Tired of sending messages to the Head of Civil Service.

The VP 1 stood on his feet to recognize a past President of NARD in the person of Dr John Onyebueze (Igwe of NARD), Who was honoured with a Standing Ovation.

The Past President of NARD Dr John Onyebueze contributed to the issues stating that, the MDCN trying to sabotage all our efforts to collect dues from HOs in order to break NARD. He further advised that rising from this meeting, an ultimatum of immediate withdrawal of the circular removing house officers from the scheme be sent out.

The VP 1 said that NMA is one of the major problems NARD is having, noting that if NMA added a little per cent to NARD struggles, most of the problems will be solved. He also noted that the head of civil service has to be called out.

3:10 pm The VP 1 said that UPTH & UNTH are indebted to NARD. He further stated that the NARD president granted an extension for them to clear the debt.

- 3:40 pm The VP 1 praised Dr Ogbe for his insight into the children of fallen heroes and also made it known that NARD has gone forth to have a foundation for issues as such.

5:31 pm Dr Kpuduwei, the South-South caucus leader observed that in the meeting, most centre presidents are absent, and Gen-Secs are the ones giving centre reports. He said that these presidents will go back home to give a different report. He concluded by saying that this is a sad situation.

5:33 pm The VP 1 gave a ten minutes timeline to call the attendance and any name unanswered will be struck off and declared absent. This decision was carried by the house.

5:34 pm The Gen-Sec of AEFUTHA concluded by saying that the centre has stepped down from contesting in the 2021/2022 secretariat bid in respect to the by-laws of the south-east caucus.

5:35 pm The Gen-Sec of ARD FMC Asaba gave his centre report.

5:38 pm The president o ARD DELSUTH gave his centre report.

5:42 pm The president of ARD FMC Bida gave his centre report.

PRESENTATION OF REPORT BY FACT-FINDING COMMITTEE.

5:45 pm The VP 1 inquired if there is anybody from the North-west caucus and there was none.

5:45 pm The crown prince (Dr Godiya Ishaya) was called upon to report his findings in the crisis in ARD FMC Gusau.

5:46 pm The crown prince said the report was meant to be given in the OGM, but due to unexpected circumstances, it was not done. The crown prince gave his report on the crisis in ARD FMC Gusau.

5:58 pm The VP 2 thanked the crown prince for a detailed report and asked the house whether to move this issue to a later time of the meeting when the President of NARD will be available. He also noted that the secretariat of NARD received a letter from the North-west Caucus leader Dr Ibrahim Umar (Diggi) and said that he would read the letter.

6:02 pm The VP 2 read the letter from the northwest caucus leader.

6:10 pm The VP 2 called on the south-south caucus leader, who is a member of the fact-finding committee to read the report of the NARD fact-finding committee that was constituted in the may OGM in Awka.

6:11 pm Dr Kpuduwei read the report of the committee. He stated that the committee finding did not include the view of the state NMA and they did not see the management and other members of the congress, as the meetings were held via zoom.

- 6:21 pm The VP 2 thanked Dr Kpuduewei after reading the report and said that query letters were forwarded to NARD by the IPP of ARD FMC Gusau, which was addressed to him and signed by the head of clinical service for the Management.
- 6:22 pm Th VP 2 read out the query letter. He then clarified that he is taking his time to bring out all documents for sake of clarity. He further asked if there is anyone from the North-West Caucus. He stated that a report was received by the NOC they, NWC will boycott the July NEC meeting. He, therefore, threw the issue to the NEC floor to find a way forward.
- 6:23 pm The South-South Caucus leader said there are two issues involved here.
- a. The crisis in ARD FMC Gusau
 - b. The attitude of the North-west Caucus.
- He suggested that the problems be split so that they can be dealt with differently. He further said that there are two factions in the centre and one faction lost all positions in NMA and ARD hence are being victimized by the other faction. The leader also said that NARD should look into the issue of withdrawing monies from the account after the handover of positions, to checkmate future occurrences of such. Furthermore, he recommended that only the year of which the withdrawal of the fund from the ARD FMC Gusau account be audited by the NARD audit committee to find out if he expended the money he withdrew in the association. On the behavior of the north West caucus, Dr Kpuduewei stated that in a NARD issue, the input of a state NMA cannot override an OGM decision of NARD, saying that it will be undermining not only the NOC but the entire NARD. 



THE COMMUNIQUE ISSUED AT THE END OF THE 40TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE OF THE NIGERIAN ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENT DOCTORS HELD AT TOSENAT 3 ARENA HOTEL AND DELTA STATE UNIVERSITY TEACHING HOSPITAL, OGHARA DELTA STATE . FROM 21ST – 27TH SEPTEMBER 2020.

PREAMBLE

The Annual General Meeting of the Nigerian Association of Resident Doctors (NARD) tagged “DELTA 2020” with the theme Health care infrastructure optimization and adaptation in the face of a global pandemic: The COVID-19 Challenge was held at DELSUTH, Delta State from 21st -27th September 2020.

The AGM was attended by 76 Chapters of the Association across the country to deliberate on issues affecting health care delivery in Nigeria, and the welfare of her members.

OBSERVATIONS

1. The AGM noted the abhorrent State some State Government have put her members in the State Tertiary Health Institutions particularly in ABSUTH Abia State IMSUTH Imo State and LASUTH Lagos.
2. AGM observes the poor state of welfare of our members at LTH Osogbo; the non-promotion and advancement of our members for over 5 years; non-implementation of 2019 CONMESS with consequential minimum wage adjustment; non-payment of life insurance and COVID-19 inducement allowance.
3. AGM observed irregular payment of Salary shortfall and arrears of part Salaries dating back to 2014 of her members across the country.
4. AGM observed that the Universal Health Coverage through the National Health Insurance Scheme is still suboptimal.
5. AGM Observed several problems associated with enrollment ranging from non- enrollment of some Federal Institutions into IPPIS up till date.
6. AGM noted failure of some Chief Medical Directors to implement the Medical Residency Training Act 2017.
7. AGM noted the commitment of Federal Government to have a collective bargaining agreement with the relevant stakeholders to determine a revised hazard allowance for health workers.
8. AGM noted the commitment of Federal Government to ensure her members get their Life Insurance claims.

RESOLUTIONS

1. AGM demands State Governments to ensure full implementation of the Medical Residency Training Act of 2017 and ensure proper funding.
2. AGM demands that Osun State Government place our members in their appropriate level and commence payment according to this promotion immediately; implement the 2019 CONMESS with consequential minimum wage adjustment; ensure payment of full life insurance; ensure payment of COVID-19 allowance and payment of all outstanding arrears.
3. AGM wishes to commend the Government of Delta, Enugu, Nasarrawa, Ekiti, Oyo, Benue, Gombe and Bauchi States for their positive contributions towards improved health care in Nigeria.
4. AGM re-affirms her commitment to the full implementation of September 2017 Memorandum of Terms of Settlement (MOTOS) with the Federal Government and continues to enjoin the FG to reciprocate the goodwill shown by NARD.

5. AGM enjoins the Federal Government to ensure full capture of the Medical Residency Training Funding in the 2021 Appropriation Bill.



THE COMMNIQUE ISSUED AT THE END OF THE PHYSICAL/VIRTUAL NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COUNCIL (NEC) MEETING AND SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE OF THE NIGERIAN ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENT DOCTORS HELD FROM 25TH TO 30TH JANUARY 2021 AT THE VILLA GARDENS HOTEL HALL, CONCORD AVENUE, NEW OWERRI, IMO STATE.

PREAMBLE

The Nigerian Association of Resident Doctors (NARD) held her National Executive Council (NEC) meeting **Tagged HEARTLAND 2021 with the theme: The Impact of The Second Wave of COVID 19 on The Healthcare Systems of Low and Medium Income Countries.** The NEC meeting held both physically and virtually from the 25th to 30th of January under the chairmanship of Prince Charles Emeka Amadi.

The climax of the activities that lined up the occasion was the opening ceremony/scientific conference which was graced by The Executive Governor of Imo State ably represented by Dr. (Mrs.) Okereke Macillina, the Special Adviser on Health, Honourable Minister of Health ably represented by Dr Kingsley Achigbu, the Medical Director of FMC Owerri, Honourable Minister of Labour and Employment ably represented by Sir Ifeanyi Amadi, Royal father of the day, HRM Eze Samuel Agunwa Ohiri, Obi of Obi-orodo the South east Cordinator National Council of Traditional Rulers of Nigeria, The National President of Nigerian Medical Association ably represented by Dr Benjamin Umezulike, the Chief of Staff to the President and Chairman NMA Ebonyi State, Dr Uche Ojemma, Past NARD President.

The NEC was attended by about 76 Chapters of the Association physically and virtually across the country to deliberate on issues affecting health care delivery in Nigeria, and the welfare of her members in the phase of the ravaging COVID 19 pandemic. After extensive deliberations on the issues affecting Residency Training and welfare of Resident Doctors in Nigeria, the following observations and resolutions were made.

OBSERVATIONS

1. The NEC observed with serious concerns the increasing rate of exposure, infection and death to COVID 19 infection among health workers especially Resident Doctors in the country.
2. The NEC also observed with dismay that despite the (1) above, the hazard allowance of health workers is still a paltry sum of 5000 naira and there is no effective Life Insurance for Doctors and other health workers who became infected or lose their lives in line of duty in Nigeria.

3. The NEC noted the efforts of Federal Government through NCDC and the PTF in combating the spread of the 2nd wave of COVID 19 pandemic in the country however, they observed that the provision of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is grossly inadequate.
4. The NEC noted the irregularities that mar the payment of the 2020 MRTF and the efforts of the current NOC in retrieving the funds paid in error to non-Resident Doctors across the country.
5. The NEC observed the non-implementation of the MRTA 2017, an Act of the Federal Government of Nigeria on Residency Training and funding in Nigeria.
6. The NEC observed with utter dismay the protracted non-payment of the arrears of Salary shortfalls for our members dating back to 2014
7. The NEC observed that the Universal Health Coverage through the National Health Insurance Scheme is still suboptimal.
8. The NEC observed with awe that the Act regulating Postgraduate Training in Nigeria was established since 1979.
9. The NEC frowned at the irregular and exorbitant amounts being paid as bench fee by our members on outside postings.
10. The NEC decry the abhorrent State some State governments have put her members in the State Tertiary Health Institutions particularly in ABSUTH, IMSUTH and ARD Taraba State.
11. NEC frowned at the recent development in DALHATU ARAF SPECIALIST Hospital (DASH), Lafia, Nasarawa State where Residency Training was said to have been suspended.

RESOLUTIONS

1. The NEC unanimously demanded that the current hazard allowance be upwardly reviewed within the next two months in other to encourage our members to continue to work at this critical moment of increasing rate of infection and mortality due to the ravaging COVID-19 pandemic and to maintain industrial harmony in the health sector.
2. The NEC resolved that the group life insurance scheme for all health workers should be speedily implemented and all health workers who have been infected or died as a result of COVID 19 infection or any other infectious diseases in the country be compensated.
3. They demanded adequate provision of Personal Protective Equipments (PPE) to all health care Institutions in the country in order to stem the current rise in infection rate among health workers.
3. They also demanded immediate universal domestication/implementation of the MRTA 2017 by all training Institutions including state owned training Institutions and ensure proper funding as stipulated by the Act.

4. NEC called on the Federal and State Governments to resume payment of arrears of salary Shortfalls to our affected members in various training Institutions across the country in order to quell the brewing agitations amongst our members.
5. They urged the National Officers Committee (NOC) of NARD to work closely with the relevant agencies of Government to expedite the payment of the 2021 Medical Residency Training Funds (MRTF) in order to prevent the mistakes made in 2020.
6. The NEC resolved that the Act establishing the Postgraduate Medical Training in Nigeria is old and therefore demanded an immediate review of the Act in line with contemporary and international best practices.
7. The NEC demanded the abolishment of bench fees for Doctors on outside postings in all training Institutions in the country.
8. NEC condemned the actions of State Governments like Imo, Abia and Taraba for the inhumane treatment meted on our members in their state and demanded immediate redress of all the issues especially that of unpaid salaries, minimum wage, corrected CONMESS and promotion of our members in their state employ. They reiterated their willingness to join the ongoing strikes by IMSUTH and ARD Taraba State in solidarity if the above issues are not quickly addressed as an injury to one is an injury to all.
9. The NEC called on the Government of Nasarawa State to urgently intervene in the crisis in DASH in order to prevent industrial disharmony especially now that we need all hands to be on deck to combat the ravaging COVID 19 infection.
10. NEC commended the Governments of Delta, Ogun, Kogi, Enugu, Nasarawa, Ekiti, Oyo, Benue, Gombe, Bauchi and Borno for their positive contributions towards improved welfare of her members and health care delivery in Nigeria
11. Finally, the NEC re-affirms her commitment to the full implementation of September 2017 memorandum of Terms of Settlement (MOTOS) with the Federal Government and enjoined the Federal Government to meet her part of the bargain in order to maintain the smooth running of the health sector especially at this critical moment of COVID 19 pandemic.





THE COMMUNIQUE ISSUED AT THE END OF THE 41ST ORDINARY GENERAL MEETING AND SCIENTIFIC CONFERENCE OF THE NIGERIAN ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENT DOCTORS CO-HOSTED BY ARD NAUTH / COOUTH PHYSICALLY/VIRTUALLY FROM 25TH –29TH MAY, 2021.

PREAMBLE

The Ordinary General Meeting (OGM) of the Nigerian Association of Resident Doctors (NARD) tagged "SYNERGY 2021" with the theme: CAREER PATHWAYS FOR DOCTORS: ADDRESSING THE NEEDLESS CONTROVERSIES AND THE WAY FORWARD held physically/virtually and was co-hosted by ARD NAUTH/COOUTH from 25th -29th May 2021

The Chairman of the occasion was Dr Uche Ojinma and the Special Guest of Honour was His Excellency, Chief Willie Obiano, Executive Governor of Anambra State.

The Chief Host was the Chief Medical Director, Nnamdi Azikiwe University Teaching Hospital.

The Keynote Speaker was Dr Nosa Orhue, Consultant Public Health Physician. Other speakers were Dr Vincent Okpala and Dr Simeon Onyemaechi.

ACTIVITIES

1. The OGM was attended by over 62 member Chapters of the Association across the country to deliberate on issues affecting health care delivery in Nigeria, and the welfare of her members.
2. Courtesy call on his Excellency, Chief Willie Obiano, Executive Governor Anambra State.
3. Courtesy call on His Royal Highness, The Igwe of Nnewi kingdom, HRH Igwe Kenneth Orizu III

OBSERVATIONS

1. The OGM appreciated the NOC and NEC for their efforts with regards the welfare of members.
2. The OGM noted the suspension of the total indefinite strike due to Government promises as entailed in the Memorandum of Actions (MOA) signed at the instance of the minister of labour Sen. Dr Chris Ngige on the 9th of April 2021 with time lines.
3. They also noted the intervention of the Hon speaker of the House of Representatives and committee on health care services.
4. The OGM noted the delays in payment of members on the GIFMIS platform which has necessitated the hardship faced by members over the last 4 months.
5. The OGM noted the willingness of Government to migrate her members from the GIFMIS to the IPPIS Platform while at the same time decries the lackluster behavior exhibited by heads of government parastatal to achieving this. The OGM observed that this has not been done and that our members are still in agony as a result of these delays.
6. They also noted some house officers are still been owed 1-2 months salaries.
7. The OGM noted that bench fee for outside postings by Resident Doctors has been abolished, and that some Chief medical directors have issued out circulars.
8. OGM noted that with regards to the non-payment of the national minimum wage consequential adjustment and all salary shortfalls, the conciliatory meeting has mandated all Chief Medical Directors to work with the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Health to submit a list of affected institutions and personnel strength for capturing in the 2021 supplementary budget to enable payment.
9. They also noted that the Chief Medical Directors in collaboration with NARD have been mandated to submit a list of salary shortfalls for 2014 to 2016. However, the committee tasked to deal with these issues of salary shortfall has not reported to the Speaker and the Minister of Labour.
10. The OGM frowned at the delay by Federal Government in sorting out the irregularities following the payment of the Medical Residency Training Fund (MRTF) 2020. It was however pleased that Government had agreed to capture the skipped payments in the supplementary budget of 2021.

The OGM noted the effort of the Presidential committee on salaries (PCS) at convoking a meeting on Tuesday, 1st June 2021 to look into the Hazard allowance of all health care workers in the country.
11. The efforts made so far with the payment of death in service insurance benefit to the next of kin of our members and other healthcare workers was duly noted by the OGM.

12. They observed with concerns the conditions of our members under different State Government employ, especially Abia, Imo and Ondo State Governments who currently owe our members twenty one (21) months, seven (7) months and four (4) months salary arrears. The OGM noted with dismay the state attitude of the Governors of Abia, Imo, and Ondo state and appointees of Government of these states to addressing the issues of payment of salaries for 21 months, 7 months and four (4) respectively.
13. OGM noted that the teaching hospitals are grossly understaffed and this is necessitated by the ongoing deadly brain drain killing the nation's health care system.

RESOLUTION

- 1 After extensive deliberations on all the issues affecting welfare of our members and insincerity of government in fulfilling their promises, the OGM unanimously resolved that our ultimatum be extended by two weeks to further give both the Federal and State Governments more time to resolve all our issues, failure of which the association shall resume the suspended total and indefinite strike action after critical appraisal in an emergency meeting.
- 2 The OGM stated unequivocally especially to the members of the public that the NARD is committed to the smooth running of the health sector however can only do so when our welfare is given the desired attention.

**THE COMMUNIQUE ISSUED AT THE END OF THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MEETING
OF THE NIGERIAN ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENT DOCTORS HOSTED BY ARD FMC UMUHIA
FROM 26TH –31ST JULY, 2021.**

PREAMBLE

The National Executive Council (NEC) of the Nigerian Association of Resident Doctors (NARD) held her National Executive Council meeting tagged Umuahia 2021 with the theme: THE NIGERIAN DOCTOR, AN ENDANGERED SPECIES: GRAPPLING WITH A PANDEMIC, POOR WORK PLACE INFRASTRUCTURE AND SECURITY THREATS in Umuahia, hosted by ARD FMC Umuahia from 26th -31st July 2021.

The Chairman of the occasion was Chief Sir G.C Onyendilefu and the Special Guest of Honour was His Excellency, Victor Okezie Ikpeazu, PhD, Executive Governor of Abia State.

The Chief Host was the Medical Director, Federal Medical Centre Umuahia, Prof. Azubuike Kanario Onyebuchi.

The Keynote Speaker was Prof. Chuks I. Kamanu, Dean Faculty of Clinical Medicine, College of Medicine and Health Sciences, Abia State University Teaching Hospital, Abia State.

ACTIVITIES

1. The NEC was attended by over 50 member Chapters of the Association across the country to deliberate on issues affecting health care delivery in Nigeria and the welfare of her members.
2. Courtesy call on His Excellency, Victor Okezie Ikpeazu, PhD, Executive Governor Abia State.
3. Courtesy call on His Royal Highness, Eze Joseph Ndubuisi Nwabeke, Chairman of the Traditional Rulers Council, Abia State.
4. Courtesy call on the Medical Director, FMC Umuahia Prof. Azubuike Kanario Onyebuchi.
5. The Doctors Reach out Program (T-DROP) was done at Mbarukwu Amuzukwu Civic Centre Umuahia Abia state.

OBSERVATIONS

1. The NEC appreciated the NOC for their efforts with regards to the welfare of members.
2. The NEC noted the suspension of the total indefinite strike action One Hundred and Thirteen (113) days ago due to Government promises as entailed in the Memorandum of Actions (MOA) signed at the instance of the Minister of Labour, Sen. Dr Chris Ngige.
3. The NEC also noted the efforts of the Hon speaker of the House of Representatives in ensuring that the Medical Residency Training Funds is captured in the supplementary budget. They however frowned at the delay by the Federal Government in disbursing the funds to our members.
4. They decried the undue hardship our members on GIFMIS platform are facing due to the delays in payment of their salaries ranging from three to seven months.
5. The NEC noted that despite Government promise to migrate her members from the GIFMIS to the IPPIS platform, they are still stuck on the GIFMIS platform which is laced with payment irregularities.
6. The NEC noted with grievous concerns the circular from the Head of Service of the Federation removing House Officers from the scheme of service and the consequent implementation by the Lagos State Government.
7. They also observed that some House Officers are still being owed 1-2 months salaries.
8. The NEC noted that bench fee for outside postings by Resident Doctors has been abolished, however some Chief Medical Directors have renamed the bench fee as training fee causing hardship on her members.
9. NEC noted that with regards the non-payment of the National Minimum Wage Consequential Adjustment, the list of affected institutions and personnel strength had since been submitted to the Federal Ministry of Health as directed by the MOA signed with the Federal Government yet nothing has been done.
10. They also noted that the Chief Medical Directors in collaboration with NARD have submitted the list of salary shortfalls for 2014 to 2016. They noted with dismay the merry-go round behavior of the Federal Ministry of Health in disbursing the salaries shortfalls to her members.
11. The efforts made so far with the payment of death in service insurance benefit to the next of kin of our members and other healthcare workers was duly noted by the NEC.
12. They observed with concerns the conditions of our members under different State Government employs, especially Abia, Imo, Ekiti and Ondo State Governments who currently owe our members nineteen (19) months, ten (10) months, six (6) months and four (4) months' salary arrears respectively. They however appreciated the promise made by the Executive Governor of Abia State during a courtesy visit to him to pay the arrears of three months out of the accumulated nineteen months salaries owed to our members in ABSUTH by Monday 2nd of August 2021.

13. They observed with serious concerns the poor response of most State Governments in domesticating the Medical Residency Training Act of 2017 while commending States like Delta and Benue which have adopted the law.
14. The NEC lamented the acute manpower shortage in most tertiary health institutions and the attendant burnout effects on our members. They noted with serious concerns that this situation is made worse by the ongoing deadly brain drain decimating the nation's health care system.
15. They bemoaned the non-remittance of her membership dues by the Registrar of Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria, Dr.T.A.B Sanusi despite following all the dictates of the Nigeria Labour law and appropriate stake holders consultations.
16. The NEC observed with serious concerns that despite several meetings with the Presidential committee on Salaries and other top Government Stakeholders on the review of hazard allowance for health workers, the hazard allowance still remains a paltry sum of five thousand naira.
17. They also noted the non-payment of COVID-19 inducement allowance to some of our members in Federal and most of our members in State Tertiary Institutions.

RESOLUTION

1. After critical appraisal of the performance of both Federal and State Governments on all the issues affecting the welfare of our members as observed above and the insincerity of Government in implementing the memorandum of action after One Hundred and Thirteen (113) days, the NEC unanimously resolved by vote to resume the total and indefinite strike action from 08.00hrs Monday 2nd August, 2021.
2. The NEC in particular demanded the immediate withdrawal of the circular removing House Officers from the scheme of service.
3. Finally, the NEC stated unequivocally especially to the members of the public that the NARD is committed to the smooth running of the health sector; however, can only do so when our welfare is given the desired attention.

**MEMORANDUM OF ACTION (MoA) REACHED AT THE CONCILIATION MEETING BETWEEN
THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT (FG) AND THE NIGERIAN
ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENT DOCTORS (NARD) HELD ON WEDNESDAY MARCH 31ST,
2021, AT THE INSTANCE OF THE HONOURABLE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT
(HML&E) IN THE CONFERENCE ROOM OF THE HONOURABLE MINISTER, FEDERAL
MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT, ABUJA.**

Following the threat to embark on a strike by the Nigerian Association of Resident Doctors (NARD), the Honourable Minister held a conciliation meeting on Wednesday, 31st March, 2021 where issues in dispute were discussed and the following conclusions were reached on these issues:

1. Non-payment of House Officers / Non-recruitment of House officers
2. Abolishment of the Bench Fees
3. Non-payment of National Minimum Wage
4. Hazard Allowance
5. Residency Training Allowance:

1. Non-payment of House Officers' Salaries:

The meeting categorized this issue into 3

- i. Federal Tertiary Health Institutions with Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria (MDCN) accredited quota of House Officers.
- ii. Federal Tertiary Health Institutions with Overflow on top of the quota
- iii. Federal Tertiary Health Institutions with House Officers employed from January till date.

On the issue of the first category, MDCN stated that the 1st category of House Officers was paid on Friday 26th, March, 2021. Evidence was tendered by Director IPPIS Department of the Office of the Accountant General of the Federation (DAGF).

On the Issue of the Overflow on top of the Quota in ii & iii above, the meeting agreed that payment should commence with the provisional lists first until the ongoing review is completed and a final list submitted. IPPIS is to make further payments as soon as the updated list from MDCN gets to them. Chairman, Committee of Chief Medical Directors (CCMD) promised to get the amended list of all institutions by tonight and tomorrow as mistakes was identified in the provisional list earlier

submitted by the Institutions. This is to enable MDCN update a final list including those employed from January to March 2021 by some few institutions (about 6 in number)..

A timeline of 3 months from date of this meeting was given to MDCN to finish re-accreditation of all the Federal Tertiary Health Institutions. MDCN gave a pledge that if need be they will recruit extra hands of experts to actualize the three (3) months timeline. CCMDs and MDCN are to review the accredited list of House officers and even the placement fortnightly. Meanwhile the Recruitment Portal will be open in two weeks.

CCMDs MDCN should inform all CMDs to apply for reaccreditation within 2 - 4 weeks.

The meeting agreed that the NIS,000 accommodation rent deducted from House Officers for the past three months should be returned to them to enable them discuss with their Hospital Management and agree on the rent payable depending on individual Hospitals

The HML&E said NARD though not a Registered Trade Union could be entitled to Check Off dues if the IPPIS had deducted the Union Dues of NARD members.

RESIDENTS ON GIFMIS PLATFORM

On the issue of payment of all salary arrears including Resident Doctors of Federal Government Institutions on GIFMIS platform, the Budget Office of the Federation affirmed that within the next three weeks they will finish with their verification and computations and effect all payments of the affected Resident Doctors. It was agreed that the timeline for actualization should be two (2) weeks. BoF and FMoH should work together on this.

Replacements for Resident Doctors that have exited the program for various reasons, should follow due process and to be undertaken as and when due.

GROUP LIFE

The NARD complained that the list of its members was not attached as specified in the Insurance Policy. The FMoH was directed to request for the list from all Institutions under the Ministry and submit to the Insurance Company. The FMoH reported that only 15 Health Facilities responded to this request. The Director (Hospital Services) FMoH is to send a reminder to all Institutions and the NARD is to follow up with the Hospitals.

In the interim, NARD is to compile list of members who died from COVID- 19 with their details and Institutions and forward same to FMoH which will in turn place Group Life claims via DHCSF to the

overseeing Insurance Companies for the payments. This should be concluded by NARD, FMOH and OHCSF within four (4) weeks from today.

2. Abolishment of the Bench Fees:

It was agreed that the policy should be abolished following due process to be initiated by Federal Ministry of Health (FMOH) through the National Council on Health. During the transition period, CMDs should waive this payment.

3. Non-payment of National Minimum Wage Consequential Adjustment Arrears:

NARD should immediately submit list of affected institutions in order for it to be captured in the 2021 Supplementary Budget. The arrears should be from April 2019 to December 2019.

4. Hazard Allowance:

Consultation on this issue is ongoing. The meeting agreed that a maximum of five weeks should be given in order for all stakeholders to converge to discuss the new Hazard Allowance rate.


5. Residency Training Allowance:

Some Officers especially Medical Officers not in training were wrongly paid this allowance; these monies have to be recovered from such recipients. It was agreed that NARD should submit a full list of such non-deserving recipients to the Chief Medical Directors (CMDs) of the affected Hospitals. The CMDs are to write affected persons to refund such monies to the Government, failing which the Federal Ministry of Health should instruct the Federal Ministry of Finance (FMOF) / DAGF to deduct such monies at source from them. Funds recovered will enable the payment of deserving NARD members for 2020.

FMOH is to check the 2021 Budget and report back on the domiciliation of this fund for the 2021 payments.

In view of these understandings, NARD National Officers Committee will consult her Executive Council with a view to giving this conciliation process a chance for industrial peace by withdrawing her Trade Dispute Notice (TDN).

Meeting agreed to reconvene four (4) weeks from today to review assignments given.



**ADDENDUM TO THE MEMORANDUM OF ACTION (MoA) OF 31st MARCH 2021 REACHED AT
THE CONCILIATION MEETING BETWEEN THE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE FEDERAL
GOVERNMENT (FG) AND THE NIGERIAN ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENT DOCTORS (NARD)
HELD ON FRIDAY APRIL 9th, 2021, AT THE INSTANCE OF THE HONOURABLE MINISTER OF
LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT (HML&E) IN THE CONFERENCE ROOM OF THE HONOURABLE
MINISTER, FEDERAL MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT, ABUJA**

As a follow up to the conciliatory meeting of March 31st, 2021, between the Federal Government and the Nigerian Association of Resident Doctors (NARD), the Honourable Minister held another conciliation meeting on Friday, 9th April, 2021 with a view to getting NARD to call off their ongoing strike and the following conclusions were reached on these issues:

1. Non-payment of House Officers / Non-recruitment of House officers
2. Abolishment of the Bench Fees
3. Non-payment of National Minimum Wage Consequential Adjustment Arrears
4. Residency Training Allowance
5. Hazard Allowance
6. Payment of Resident Doctors on GIFMIS platform

1. NON-PAYMENT OF HOUSE OFFICERS (H/Os)' SALARIES:

The meeting noted the efforts of the Medical and Dental Council (MDCN) and DAGF and praised them for working over the holidays to effect payments. The meeting however noted that the payment of the House Officers' salaries experienced some irregularities as double payments were made to some H/Os in some centers and a few have not been paid as of date. In view of this situation, a 5 man Committee was set up to harmonize the list of the names submitted by NARD, Chairman, Committee of Chief Medical Directors (CCMD) with MDCN. The Committee was to work for 72 hours and produce a valid list to IPPIS through the Federal Ministry of Health (FMoH).

The Committee is made up of:

a) FMoH

ii). IPPIS is to as soon as possible create a platform where all payments made and the recipients would be made available for accessibility and information, without which it would be difficult to determine those that have been paid and those not paid.

iii). IPPIS should adopt the folio number of H/Os as a means of identification of them as they are being engaged and for their payments.

2. ABOLISHMENT OF THE BENCH FEES:

It was earlier agreed as part of MoA 1 that the policy should be abolished following due process to be initiated by Federal Ministry of Health (FMoH) through the National Council on Health (NCH). During the transition period, CMDs are to waive this payment. The Permanent Secretary FMoH is to issue a circular to this effect and send a Memorandum on this for ratification at NCH whenever convened.

3. (A) NON-PAYMENT OF NATIONAL MINIMUM WAGE CONSEQUENTIAL ADJUSTMENT ARREARS

(B) SALARY SHORTFALL IN 2014 - 2016 OF RESIDENT DOCTORS

NARD and CCMDs should immediately submit list of affected institutions and personnel strength in order for it to be captured in the 2021 Supplementary Budget. The arrears should be from April 2019 to December 2019 as in MoA 1.

The Budget Office of the Federation (BoF) informed that a circular was earlier issued by the Honourable Minister of Finance setting up a Committee to look into the issue of all shortfalls and is chaired by the Director General (DG) BoF.

The CCMDs and the Permanent Secretary of the FMoH are to work on this with the assistance of the BoF in order to also capture it in the Supplementary 2021 Budget. The

special issue of the 2014 – 2016 Salary Shortfall is to be treated here too. Two (2) weeks is dedicated to this.

4. RESIDENCY TRAINING ALLOWANCE

It was reported that 558 people who are not Residents were wrongly paid and bonafide Residents who were not paid are 1003 in number. Those not paid will be captured in the 2021 Supplementary Budget while those wrongly paid will be requested to refund same. The Office of the Accountant General of the Federation (OAGF) is to provide a special account for this remittance. The Post Graduate Medical College is to henceforth compile the list of all Residents eligible for this payment and transmit to the Budget Office (BoF) through the Federal Ministry of Health.

5. HAZARD ALLOWANCE

The meeting noted that the issue is not peculiar to NARD but cuts across the entire Health Sector and her workforce. The meeting was informed that the Presidential Committee on Salaries (PCS) would be meeting on Monday, 12th April, 2021 at the Federal Ministry of Finance to examine the hazard allowance issue with National Salaries, Incomes and Wages Commission (NSIWC) after which the Nigeria Medical Association (NMA), Joint Health Sector Unions (JHESU), NARD and other stakeholders will meet on Wednesday, 14th April, 2021 in the Federal Ministry of Labour (FMLSE) with their position papers with the PCS.

NARD is to come with their position paper as part of the NMA team.

GROUP LIFE INSURANCE PAYMENT

On Group Life Insurance claims for deceased NARD members, NARD should facilitate the compilation of the list of deceased members by CMDs at the appropriate desk in their institutions. This will be forwarded to the relevant insurance Companies for payment through the FMoH.

This should be accomplished on or before end of April 2021.



6. PAYMENT OF RESIDENTS ON GIFMIS PLATFORM

The meeting noted that NARD is happy with the progress being made to migrate affected Doctors from GIFMIS to IPPIS platform before the end of April 2021. IPPIS confirmed that one week after getting the verified list from BoF, payment will be made.


In view of these understandings, NARD National Officers Committee (NoC) will consult urgently her Executive Council with a view to giving this conciliation process a chance for industrial peace by calling off the strike embarked on 1st April 2021.

NARD is to communicate to the Honourable Minister of Labour and Employment on their decision before 12 noon of 10th April, 2021.

No member of NARD is to be punished for this strike.

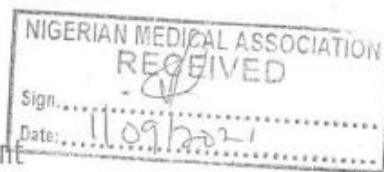

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU) REACHED AT THE END OF THE EMERGENCY MEETING HELD WITH THE LEADERSHIP OF NIGERIAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION (NMA) INCLUDING THE THREE AFFILIATE ASSOCIATIONS – NIGERIAN ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENT DOCTORS (NARD), MEDICAL & DENTAL CONSULTANTS' ASSOCIATION OF NIGERIA (MDCAN), MEDICAL & DENTAL SPECIALISTS ASSOCIATION IN BASIC MEDICAL SCIENCES (MEDSABAMS), MEDICAL & DENTAL COUNCIL OF NIGERIA - AND THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT SIDE REPRESENTED BY THE FEDERAL MINISTRIES OF HEALTH, AND FINANCE, BUDGET AND NATIONAL PLANNING, BUDGET OFFICE OF THE FEDERATION (BoF), NATIONAL SALARIES INCOMES AND WAGES COMMISSION (NSIWC) AND THE OFFICE OF THE HEAD OF THE CIVIL SERVICE OF THE FEDERATION (OHCSF) OVER THE TRADE DISPUTES BY THE NIGERIAN ASSOCIATION OF RESIDENT DOCTORS (NARD), AND THREAT OF STRIKE BY MDCAN, AND MEDSABAMS

CALLED AT THE INSTANCE OF THE HONOURABLE MINISTER OF LABOUR AND EMPLOYMENT ON AUGUST 20, 2021

The Nigerian Association of Resident Doctors (NARD) had on the 2nd of August, 2021 embarked on an indefinite and total strike nationwide over some outstanding issues bordering on its members welfare. Additionally, the Medical and Dental Consultants' Association of Nigeria (MDCAN) had issued 21 days ultimatum on July 25, 2021 to embark on strike over the NSIWC circular to the Accountant General of the Federation (AGF) removing their members on CONMESS Salary Structure in six Universities on Academics duties to the CONUASS Salary Structure and thereby reducing their income. In the same vein, the Association of Doctors in Academics had taken the NSIWC to court and obtained a Court Injunction restraining the NSIWC and Accountant General of the Federation (AcGF) from implementing the contents of the said circular removing their members from CONMESS to CONUASS.

The Nigerian Medical Association (NMA) was invited to intervene by the Forum of Medical Elders after consultation with both NMA, Federal Ministry of Health, and Hon. Minister of Labour and Employment with a view to resolving the issues as the NMA is the umbrella body of all Medical Doctors' Associations in Nigeria. The issues presented for discussion were as follows;

A. NMA/NARD Issues

- i. Non-payment of salaries of some House Officers on the IPPIS platform.
- ii. Non-payment of Medical Residency Training Fund (MRTF) outstanding, 2020 and the current 2021 allocation.
- iii. Non-payment of arrears on Consequential Adjustment on National Minimum Wage (NMW)
- iv. Abolition of Bench Fee
- v. Delay in payment of Hazard Allowance
- vi. Non-payment of skipping Arrears for 2014, 2015 and 2016
- vii. Withdrawal of HOCSE Circular removing House Officers and NYSC Doctors from the Scheme of Service

- viii. Non-payment of salaries of Resident and Locum Doctors on GIFMIS and the issue of their Migration to Integrated Personnel Payroll Information System (IPPIS)
- ix. Non-payment of outstanding COVID-19 Special Hazard allowance for 2020 for some Medical Doctors in Government Clinics/Hospitals.

B. NMA/MDCAN/MEDSABAMS Issues

- i. Withdrawal of National Salaries Incomes and Wages Commission Circular removing Doctors in the Academia from the CONMESS.
- ii. Implementation of CONMESS and correction of entry point disparity for all Medical lecturers and Honorary Consultants.

2. After exhaustive deliberations, the meeting resolved as follows:

i. Non-Payment of Salaries of Some House Officers on the IPPIS Platform

The NARD reported that 114 of its members are still owed between one to four months salaries arrears since January, 2021, even as the MDCN had not paid everybody. MDCN Registrar informed that payment had been made to a total of 2800 House Officers nationwide as cleared and submitted by their institutions as at 31st July, 2021. That those who have not been paid are either those that are yet to be cleared by their institution or those with issues with their account numbers. He further informed that submissions not received on or before the 15th of every month by the Council are carried over to the next month.

The meeting resolved that NARD should submit the list of outstanding House Officers whose salaries have not been paid to the FMOH through the CMDs so that the Council can ensure payment with the outstanding in the September, 2021 salary.

ii. Non-Payment of Medical Residency Training Fund (MRTF) Outstanding 2020 and Current 2021 Allocation

After deliberations and based on the figures of the BoF, it was resolved that the outstanding claims of MRTF 2020 (N617, 429,121.00) shall be paid immediately after verification and reconciliation of the 540 non-eligible Doctors in this respect who had received money from the allocation to enable payment to the verified Doctors.

For MRTF 2021 (N4, 802, 828,800.00), the recommendation for the release had been made and approved by the Honourable Minister of Finance, Budget and National Planning; the fund has been secured, and the required submissions have been received, so payment would be done within one week.

iii. Non-Payment of Arrears on Consequential Adjustment on National Minimum Wage (NMW)

The meeting noted that the Health and Educational Sectors were affected by the shortage in the N160B budgeted for this in 2019. After deliberations, it was resolved that the FMOH is to issue a circular to the Federal Health Institutions by Monday, August 23, 2021. Claims are to be submitted to the FMOH within one week hence for onward transmission to BoF for verification and subsequent payment to start within one month. The payments are expected to be from 2021 service-wide votes spill over done via 2022 Budget in order to bring this issue to a close.

iv. Abolition of Bench Fee

It was agreed that this issue has been resolved and all payments made in error under other titles related to bench fees be refunded to the Residents concerned. A circular to this effect had been sent out to the Tertiary Hospitals by the FMOH since one month ago. Any NARD member who had paid since the abolition should seek for a refund.

v. Delay in Payment of Hazard Allowance

After deliberations, it was agreed that negotiation at the level of the Presidential Committee on salaries will resume and government shall interface separately with JOHESU and NMA as demanded by NMA with a view to speedily concluding negotiations. The meeting with the NMA shall be convened tentatively by the first week of September, 2021, to enable them do their National Executive Council (NEC) meeting holding next week.

vi. Non-Payment of Skipping Arrears for 2014, 2015 and 2016

The meeting noted that all the Health Workers had skipped and still on it since 2017, and the issue being raised concerns arrears. After deliberation, it was agreed that the issue of the payment of the arrears of skipping as it affects Doctors and other Health Workers would be addressed holistically.

vii. Withdrawal of HCSCF Circular Removing House Officers and NYSC Doctors from the Scheme Of Service

The meeting resolved that NMA should submit her position immediately to the FMOH PS (FMOH) for onward transmission to HCSCF with a view to processing and issuance of a clarification Circular within two months.

viii. Migration of Doctors to Integrated Personnel Payroll Information System (IPPIS)

The case of the Medical Doctors and other Health Professionals employed without approved recruitment waivers from HCSCF by the UCH Ibadan, University of Calabar Teaching Hospital, and University of Port-Harcourt Teaching Hospital, and who were being paid on GIFMIS was noted.

These Institutions have now been given recruitment waivers by DHCSF which is one of the criteria for enrolment on the IPPIS platform. They should now be enrolled immediately.

Secondly, for the Doctors on Locum appointment, NARD/CMDs should submit a comprehensive list from all affected Institutions on or before August 31, 2021, through the FMOH for processing with a view to obtaining waiver from the DHCSF and appropriate Government Agencies.

The meeting noted that Locum Doctors are not ghost workers and resolved that the BoF should restore the earlier arrangement to continue their payments on GIFMIS after verification of the earlier lists submitted by the Hospitals. Also, the backlogs of arrears on GIFMIS referred above are to be paid under similar arrangements after verification starting from Monday, August 31, 2021.

ix. Non-Payment of Outstanding COVID-19 Special Hazard Allowance 2020 to some Doctors in Health Institutions Especially Members of MEDSABAMS & Doctors in the University Clinics

The meeting resolved that the FMOH should do a reminder to the Honourable Minister of Finance, Budget and National Planning to request for the payment of the outstanding list already compiled. MEDSABAMS was again advised to route their case if any through their employers – the Federal Ministry of Education in order to present their case to the Minister of Finance, Budget and National Planning.

x. Withdrawal of National Salaries Incomes and Wages Commission Circular removing Doctors in the Academia from CONMESS, implementation of CONMESS for all medical Lecturers and correction of entry point disparity for Medical Consultant Lecturer.

The meeting noted that this issue is of concern particularly to Medical Consultant Lecturers who on passing Part II Fellowship are made Lecturer I and consequently dropping from their earlier income on Senior Registrar I. After deliberations the meeting was informed that action in respect of the Circular under reference has been put on hold as directed by the interim injunction issued by the National Industrial Court (NICN). The meeting also set up a Technical Committee comprising of NMA and its affiliates, FMOE, FMOH, BDF, FML&E, NUC, DHCSF and NSIWC in respect of those institutions paying Medical Academic Staff and six (6) Universities on CONMESS. and NSIWC as chairman and convener. The Committee was given four weeks to come up with recommendations on these issues and all other sundry issues raised by NMA on ways to stem the current brain drain affecting the health sector. The first meeting was scheduled for Tuesday 31st August, 2021. It was also resolved that the meeting between MDCAN and NSIWC scheduled for 24th August, 2021 should continue and report submitted to the new Committee. The NMA also promised

to facilitate the withdrawal/Out of Court Settlement of the on-going matter at the National Industrial Court of Nigeria (NICN) to pave way for unfettered negotiation.

xi. Issues with Some State Governments on:

- a) Domestication of Medical Residency Training Programme (MRTP) and Medical Residency Training Fund (MRTF).
- b) Non-Payment of both COVID-19 Allowance and Consequential National Minimum Wage Adjustment.
- c) Non-Payment of Salaries to NARD Members by some State Governments ranging from 2 to 19 months.

The Honourable Minister of Labour and Employment promised to talk to the Governors through the Nigerian Governors' Forum (NGF)



**PAYMENT OF MONTHLY ALLOWANCES TO INTERNS/NYSC DOCTORS AND
NYSC HEALTH PROFESSIONALS IN THE FEDERAL HEALTH SECTOR**

Further to Circular No. HCSF/SPSO/ODD/NCE/CND.100/S.10/III/112 dated 12th April 2021 from the Office of the Head of the Civil Service of the Federation conveying the decision reached at the 42nd meeting of the National Council on Establishment for the removal of internship programmes/ housemanship/NYSC doctors from the Scheme of Service, the National Salaries, Incomes and Wages Commission hereby issues the table of allowances to be paid to the interns attached as Annex I. These allowances have been derived from their current remunerations as applicable in the Federal Public Service such that there is no loss in earnings. The allowances in Annex I will be adjusted if future changes occur in the professional allowances by follow-up circulars from the Commission.

Continuation

2. In line with the provisions in paragraph 1F of Circular No. SWC/5/04/S.176/T/73 dated 4th July, 2014 on "Clarifications and Adjustment on Certain Health Professional Allowances" (copy attached as Annex II) issued by the Commission, medical doctors serving under the National Youth Service Scheme should be paid the current rate of NYSC monthly allowance of ₦33,000.00 by the National Youth Service Corps, in addition to receiving the following from their places of primary assignment:
 - (a) housing/transport stipends; and
 - (b) approved professional allowances (call duty, hazard) at the rate applicable to House Officers.
3. Also, Health Professionals listed in Annex I serving under the National Youth Service Scheme should be paid the current rate of NYSC monthly allowance of ₦33,000.00 by the National Youth Service Corps, in addition to receiving the following from their places of primary assignment:
 - (a) housing/transport stipends; and
 - (b) approved professional allowances (call duty or shift duty, and hazard) at the rate applicable to the Interns of their cadre.
